Padres, Durbin A's reverse fortunes, earn playoff berths

Change is in the November air ...

If the North Coast Padres and Durbin A's meet on Saturday in the 2009 Roy Hobbs World Series, it will be in the playoffs and a semifinal game.

The Padres and A's, almost perennial Saturday opponents in games involving winless teams, both won their opening games of the World Series Sunday.

The Padres started the parade, using a 2-run, 9th-inning rally to defeat the Chicago Phillies 6-5. And Sunday evening, the A's parlayed a 5-run first inning into a 13-1 victory over the Akron Brewers.

From 2005 through 2008, the A's are 5-21 with only 2 wins in pool play, and the Padres are 2-24 with 1 win in pool play. Both teams were 1-6 in 2008, with those two wins coming on Saturday, and, in one of those games, the A's defeated the Padres.

Back to 2009 ... Both the A's and padres have earned berths in the playoffs.

Back-to-back base hits by Chris McLaughlin and Mark Inman drove home Mark Feeney and Inman in the bottom of the ninth to make Shawn McLaughlin a complete-game winner over the Phillies.

Paul Wojcicki gave the A's a 7-inning complete game performance in the victory over the Brewers. He struck out 4 and gave up 4 hits.

Tommy McAullife's bases-loaded triple in the first inning began his 5 RBI night and led to a 5-0 lead in the first.

And, of course, that leads to a lot of fans cheering when the Cardinales turn it on on the ball field.

The fact that his Cardinales have been successful on the field the past two years has been a bonus, and it has been special with so many family members in Fort Myers to share in the success.

Among those attending this year is Mayra Melendz who says she's a big supporter of the team and her husband.

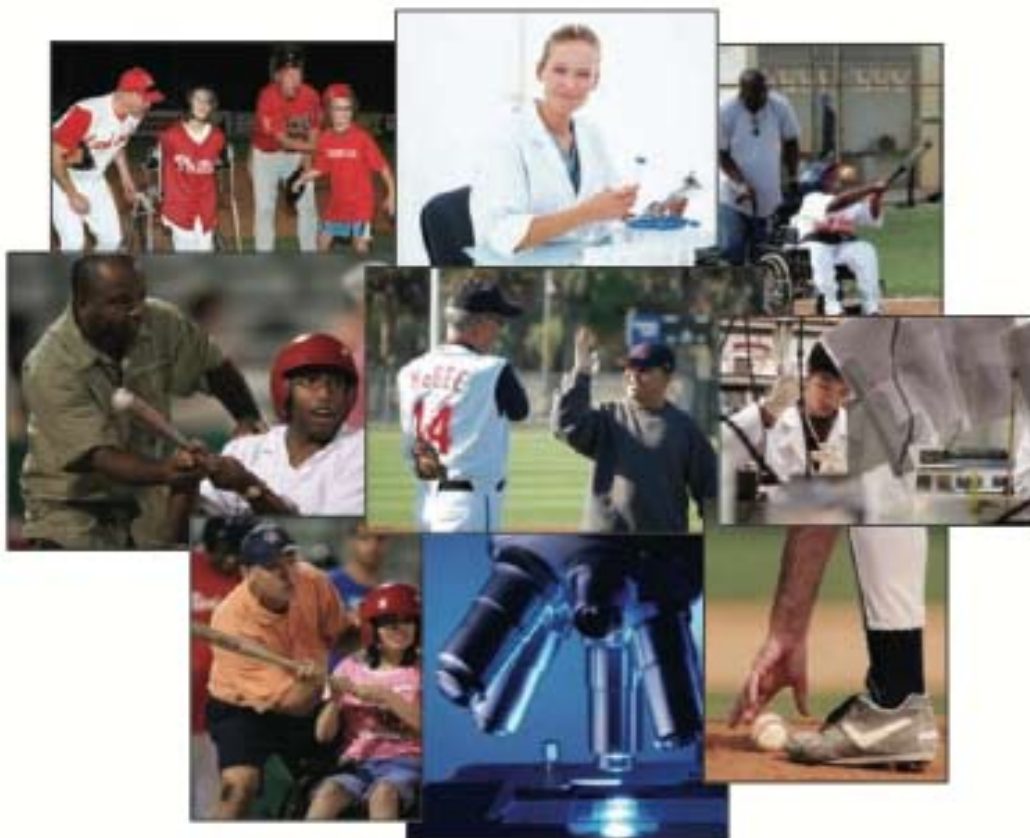
