Hobbs Series a family affair for Bub Global teammates

Roy Hobbs Baseball

The Roy Hobbs World Series is REALLY a family affair for the Bub Global NJ Dodgers.

Five of the members are named Clark—two sets of brothers and a cousin.

They've played together ever since Little League when they played for three fathers—Bub, Globe and Ken—thus the name for their World Series team, honoring their fathers.

And last year when Ken coached the team in the 2010 Roy Hobbs World Series, they won the AA Legends Championship—their first family baseball outing to a Roy Hobbs event.

Ken passed away this year in February. Globe died in 1964, Bub in 1965, within 4 months of each other when the family was still in the little leagues and Globe's wife Mary Higgins Clark was a fledgling short-story writer whose mystery and suspense books have sold 80 million U.S. copies since 1975.

The Little League Park where the sons and fathers played in Washington Township, NJ, has been named Clark Field as an honor to the Clarks.

Ken Jr is Ken's son; Glenn and Kevin are Bub's sons. And Warren and Dave are Globe's sons.

Team photo plan

Just a reminder that if any team wants to get signed up for the photo plan this week, the manager should call Greg Wagner at either 239-277-3100 (office phone) or 239-898-8677 (cell phone) any time on Monday in order to get on the schedule for Tuesday, Thursday, Friday or Saturday.

Time is of the essence now, and Wagner Photography would need to hear from interested teams on Monday, even if it's Monday night.

Player ID cards

Just a reminder that all players must have their player I.D. cards with them at games.

No card, no play, and Roy Hobbs reserves the right to do card checks at games. Players without their ID cards will not be allowed to continue to play and will be required to bring his ID card to the Tournament Director or Site Manager before being allowed to return to the playing field.

Replacement cards are available at the Roy Hobbs Headquarters. Bring a photo ID to verify identity, and the fee is \$5.

So, please don't lose the card and please keep it with you.

Pitching

For the record, here is a recap on the rules on pitching eligibility for the playoffs.

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 15 hitters – during pool play.

This is a reminder to all managers that all pitching statistics need to be updated through the first 4 games by noon Wednesday.

When AAAA-AAA playoffs begin Thursday, all managers will be supplied with a list of pitchers eligible to start-close.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come

to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is important as the "spirit of the rule" is that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

So here's a reminder to Managers to enter their statistics after each game on line.

The program will give you cumulative totals for all your games, and Roy Hobbs will be checking those on Wednesday morning to produce pitching data to determine which pitchers will be eligible for starting-closing roles in the playoffs.

Vendor Sales

Roy Hobbs is creating a vendors area on the concrete pad next to the Lee County Stadium batting cages.

Currently, bat and glove vendors are setting up there, along with the Massage therapists.

The site was chosen to accommodate hard goods vendors, especially so that bat buyers would have a place to swing and get the feel of the merchandise.

It should be noted that Vendors are prohibited from

selling bats or other merchandise from trunks of cars, in parking lots or at the playing fields, either in the stands or in the dugouts.

Drink water

Even though it is a little cooler, this still stands true... Drink Water.

This is just a reminder that with the heat and the humidity that everyone needs to stay hydrated. The heat is sneaky. Don't let it sneak up on you.

Everyone needs to keep drinking water before games and throughout games. Once you get into a heat problem, you cannot make up the lost fluid in a hurry, and it takes time to replace a body's fluids once they are depleted.

Ice for the injured ...

Just a reminder that Roy Hobbs is willing to furnish ice for injuries.

However, we advise managers from the start that they need to provide ice for pitchers arms, if needed. That's something to plan for ... injuries are another story.

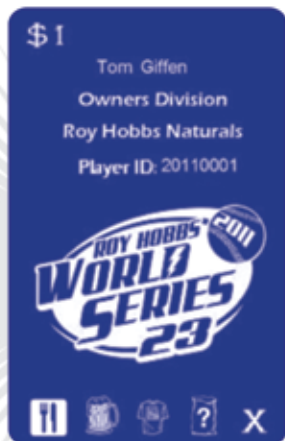
Several dugouts were left pretty messy after Sunday's games.

Warren explained how his dad got his name. "He had no hair since he was 30 and somebody started calling him Globe. It stuck."

Bub's nickname came about because Globe couldn't pronounce "brother" but called him "Bub". And that stuck.

The team has its own 2011 calendar. The cover is the five Clarks and photos from the ball field are throughout with "inspiring" quotes as captions.

This came about when Warren surprised the team to honor them for their winning ways in the series.

This year, win or lose, they're planning another calendar featuring the whole team.

When not on the ball field, the Clarks earn a living in a variety of ways.

Glenn is a grammar school principal; Warren is a lawyer and judge; Ken is an executive for a freight company, Kevin is a poetry professor at Cal Poly University and Dave owns a marketing company.

And baseball really runs in Warren's family. His wife, Sharon, was commissioner of baseball for the town of Ridgeville, NJ, and that encompasses T-ball and semi-pro.

Warren sums up his team as "We're all a band of brothers, we're all Bubs"
