



Setting the 55s playoffs for AAA-AA-A and Vintage

The single-elimination playoff brackets in the Legends and Vintage Divisions will be settled after Thursday's fifth pool game.

The **Legends field** will be broken into 3 groups – AAA, AA, A – based on record, runs allowed and the logistics of handling all of those teams in single-elimination playoffs. (Multiple Winless teams will have their own bracket of games Friday & Saturday.)

The **Vintage Field** will be determined early Thursday afternoon with a meeting of all interested Vintage managers as we evaluate whether we keep one 12-team division or split along the lines of 4-8, 6-6 or 8-4.

Since all Vintage teams play morning games Thursday, we will meet with the Vintage managers about 2 p.m. at the Lee County Headquarters to discuss how to set up the brackets.

The Friday pairings for the non-AAAA playoffs will be announced Thursday night at the respective division's Pairings Parties.

The **Legends'** Thursday party will be held at **MacDaddy's Grill & Pub**, at 8951 Daniels Parkway (halfway between Six Mile Cypress and I-75), including complimentary snack foods and non-alcoholic drinks, starting at 7 p.m.

The **Vintage** playoff pairings will be announced at **Jason's Deli**, located at 13550 Reflections Drive (just off Cypress Lake Drive east of Summerlin), including complimentary snack foods and non-alcoholic drinks, starting at 7 p.m.

A cash bar will be available at both parties. The Friday pairings and game schedule will be announced FIRST at the Parties and then posted by 9 p.m. at the World Series Headquarters at the Lee County Ticket Office, on royhobbs.com and on the message line (239-533-7694).

Legends AAAA starts with 4 teams;

The double-elimination Legends Division AAAA playoffs were determined Wednesday evening with only 4 teams selected for the division.

The 4 teams are: Washington Titans, New England Red Sox and NorCal Giants at 4-0, with Minnesota Bandits in a 3-1.

As the Roy Hobbs Advisory Committee met late Wednesday afternoon, there were concerns that there were not 8 teams that could compete at the AAAA double-elimination level. Options included going ahead with an 8-team division, dropping it to a 4- or 6-team division, or eliminating the double-elimination format.

The solution was to go to the 4-team double-elimination playoff starting Thursday, as the Minnesota Bandits elected to take the fourth berth in the AAAA double-elimination playoffs.

The 4-team double-elimination will see two games on Thursday, two on Friday and two on Saturday, with the championship scheduled for 6:30 p.m. Saturday at Lee County Stadium.

MVP & team awards

MVP and team award certificates should be redeemed at the Roy Hobbs World Series Headquarters at the Lee County Stadium ticket office when the time comes.

Every team has an MVP certificate to redeem, and Managers or the honored player can come to the office and see Meranda Estridge, Tony Anarumo or Rob Giffen to get the award order taken care of.

The team award, which goes to any team winning at least 5 games in the World Series, can be redeemed at the office as well. Please see Tony Anarumo or Rob Giffen to redeem your award.

Pitching

For the record, here is a recap on the rules on pitching eligibility for the playoffs.

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 15 hitters – during pool play.

This is a reminder to all managers that all pitching statistics need to be updated through the first 4 games by noon Wednesday.

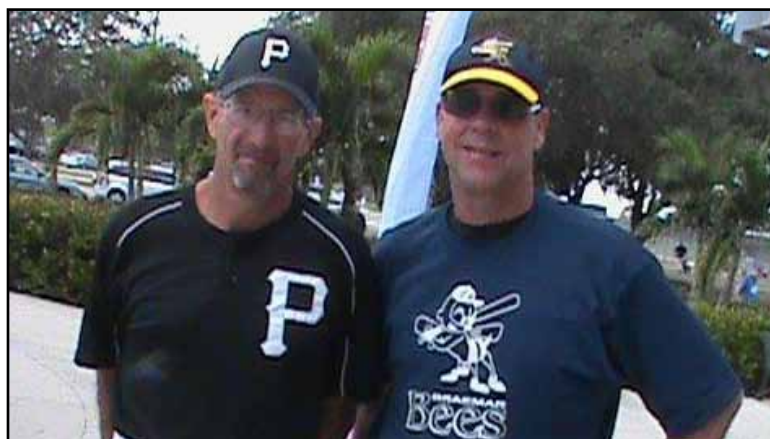

The Roy Hobbs World Series prides itself on the friendships that develop between players and it's a chance for old neighbors to get together once a year after one has moved away.

Robert Kohring Jr and Mark Weber were neighbors and played ball together for years in Toledo, OH. They came to the Series each year with the Toledo Paramount.

Then Mark moved to Minnesota and joined the Minnesota Bees.

They keep in touch all year, but the Series provides an opportunity for face-to-face meeting for the two postmen.

Even though "we're mortal enemies now," said Mark.

The first thing they do upon arrival is find out where the other is staying and make sure they wind up in the same place.

Mark is a catcher and Bob is a pitcher. When they first became neighbors, they found out their mutual love for baseball, so evenings would find Bob in Mark's backyard pitching to him.

And that was their role with the Paramount in previous World Series.

Mark had a close health call this year. He was diagnosed with Bladder cancer. Six weeks of chemo failed to affect him, so he had surgery and the cancer was removed---successfully.

During his ordeal, Bob called him every day, offering encouragement to his friend. While he was recuperating, he pressed him to get back to baseball as soon as he could.

And After 6 weeks, he started trying to get back in shape for the ball field.

"I was determined to get back...I'm not in tip-top shape but I've got two games under my belt and nothing bad has happened."

Both are looking forward to the time they'll play ball together in the Hobbs Series, but this time it'll be against each other.

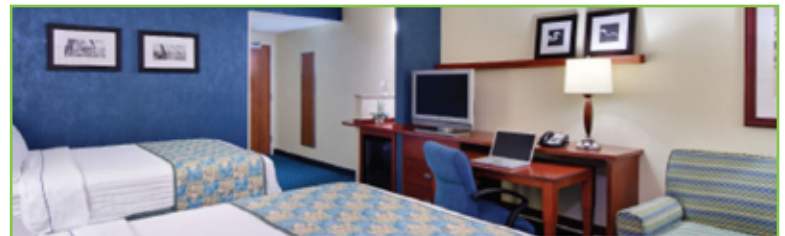

When AAAA-AAA playoffs begin Thursday, all managers will be supplied with a list of pitchers eligible to start-close.

Finally, in the playoffs, those “non-qualified” middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is important as the “spirit of the rule” is that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as “inning-eaters” are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

So here’s a reminder to Managers to enter their statistics after each game on line.

The program will give you cumulative totals for all your games, and Roy Hobbs will be checking those on Wednesday morning to produce pitching data to determine which pitchers will be eligible for starting-closing roles in the playoffs.

If you need assistance, please contact Rob Giffen at World Series Headquarters.

Championship & MVP Rings, T-shirts

The Herff-Jones ring representative for Roy Hobbs Baseball will be available Friday afternoon, Saturday and Sunday morning to talk with interested teams and players about team championship rings and MVP rings.

Jamie Pruitt will represent Herff-Jones, and he will have ring samples, pricing and sizing materials. He will be located at the Roy Hobbs World Series Headquarters at Lee County Stadium.

All RHWS championship teams may purchase rings, applying any or all of their winning stipend to the fee. AAAA teams win the rings or a waiver fee to the 2012 RHWS.

Championship teams may also purchase a RHWS Championship T-Shirt, which should be delivered within 10 days. Staff members will be modeling that shirt on Friday

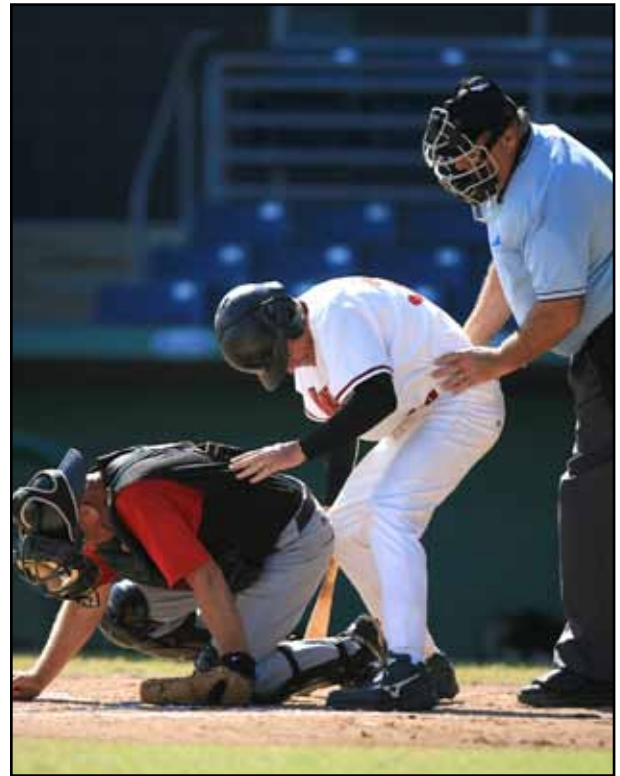
