Masters playoff pairings set for AA-A-B divisions; Vintage ready Friday PM

The Tidewater Drillers received the top seed in the AA playoff bracket announced Thursday evening at RJ Gators Seafood Grill.

The Huntsville Hitmen topped the A bracket, and at the B bracket drawing, the Monroe Muskrats won the top seed.

The playoff pairings were relatively easy to handle by the numbers, said Roy Hobbs President Tom Giffen, in making the announcements.

The AA and A brackets each have 12 teams, the B bracket 14 teams. And all the playoffs get under way Friday.

In the AA and A brackets, 4 teams received byes, but there were several teams that missed out on byes when they did not win their games on Thursday, that being by Roy Hobbs Thursday game guidelines.

In the A bracket there was an adjustment in the matchups when the 7-10 seeds came from the same league and cannot be paired by rule. So #1 Salem-Pittsburgh Warlocks will play #9 DuPage Indians and #10 Kenmore Eastern Brewers will play #8 Kentucky Orioles.

Playoff pairings in the Vintage Division will be announced at 5:30 p.m. at the Roy Hobbs World Series headquarters. Those pairings will be put on the Roy Hobbs webpage before 6 p.m.

The Vintage Division will play its fifth pool game Friday, getting ready for Saturday's playoffs.

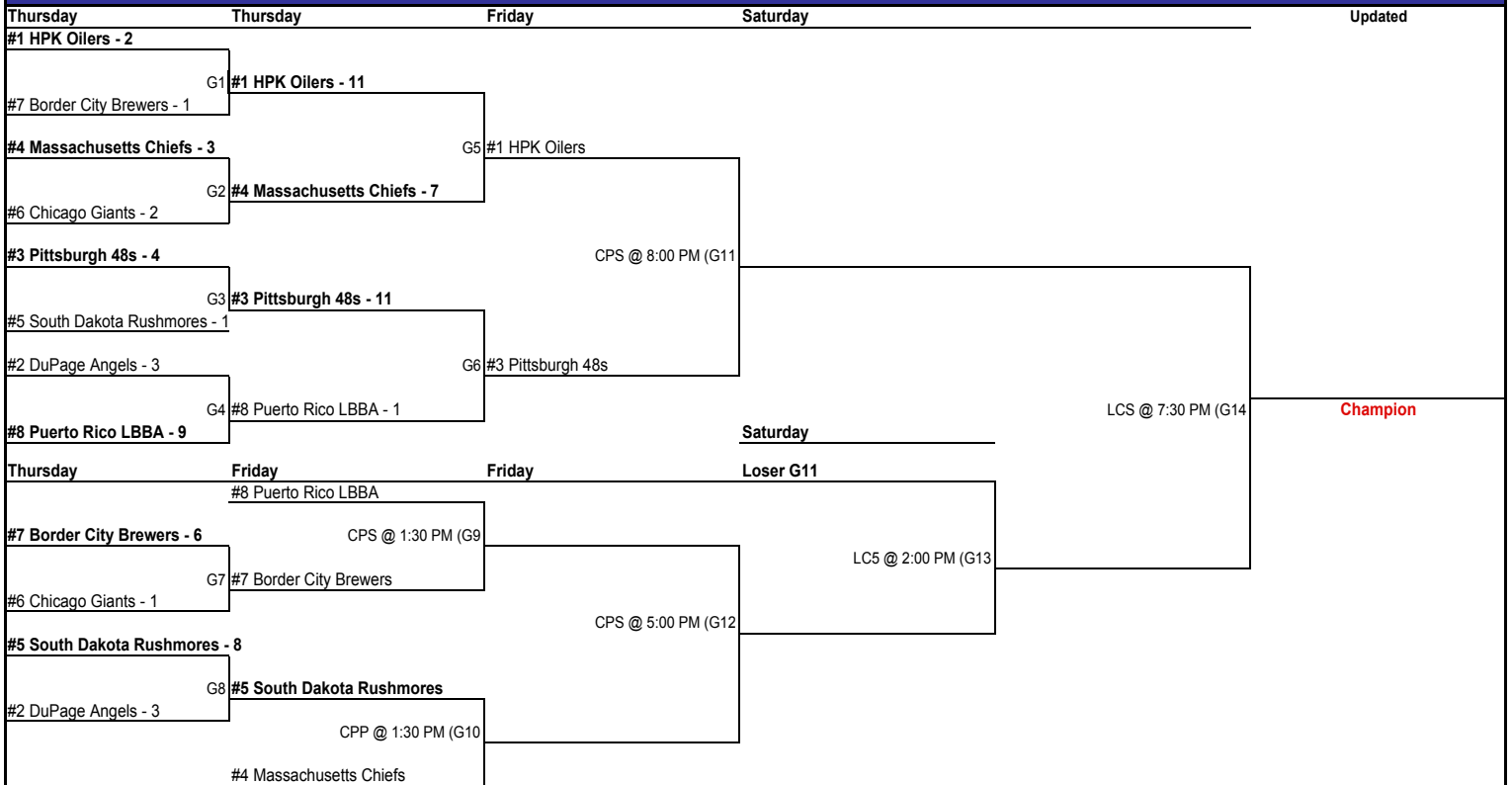
In the Vintage Division, however, a decision was made Thursday by Roy Hobbs Baseball in consultation with several managers to adjust the playoff set up and institute a second playoff division.

So there will be the expected AAA playoffs, which will include the top 7 teams, with the No. 1 team getting a first round bye. A second B Division, will include the bottom 4 teams in a two-round playoff Saturday.

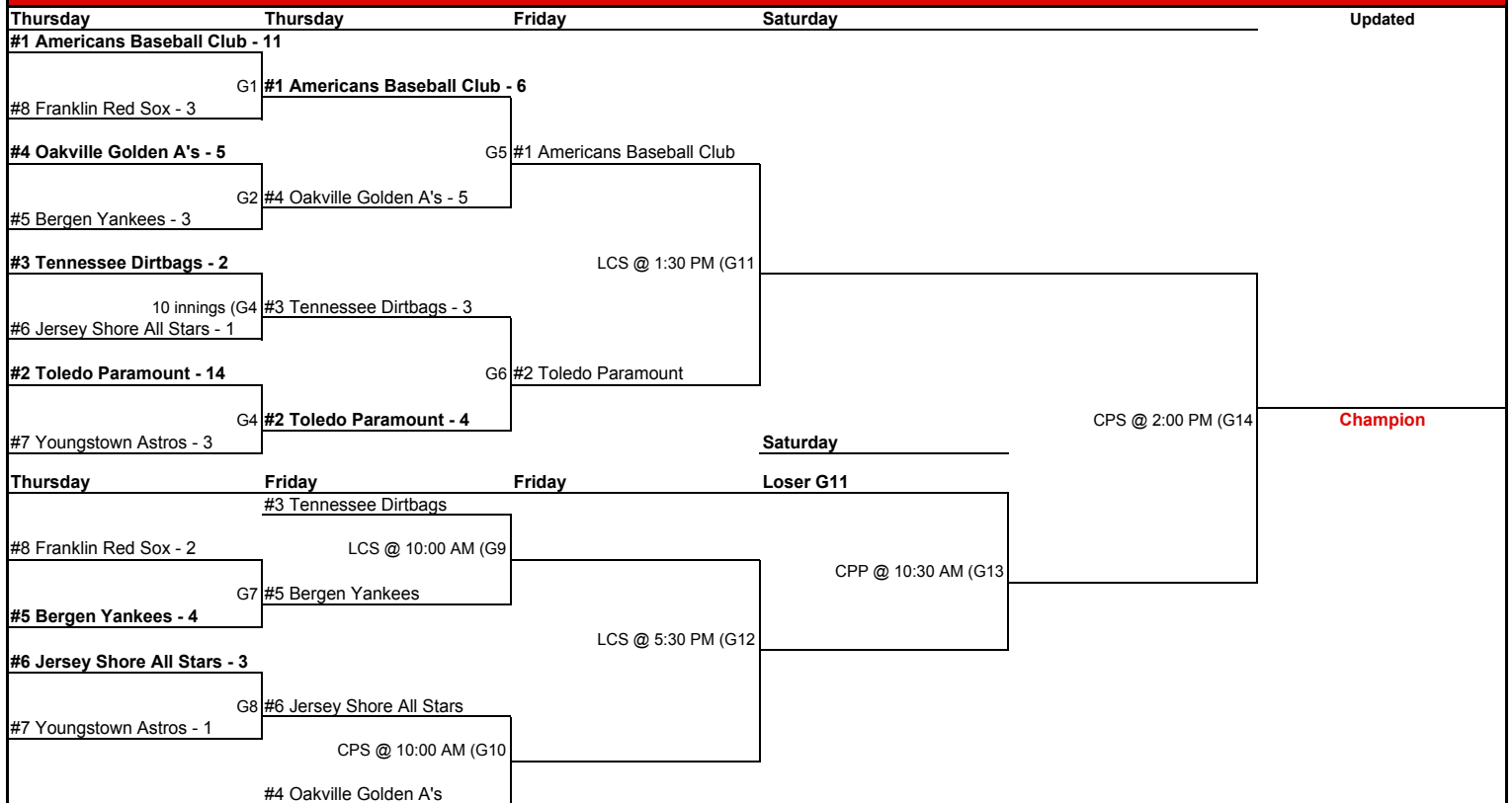
In Friday's play, however, with 11 teams, one team had to receive a bye. The South Dakota Pheasants accepted Roy Hobbs Baseball offer of the bye, with an automatic No 2 seeding in the AAA playoffs.

The Pheasants are 4-0 and in second place behind the Chicago Spirit. The next best record is 2-2 in the division, so regardless of Friday's results, the Pheasants could not drop lower than second. And, with the agreement, regardless of what Chicago does Friday, the Pheasants cannot advance to the No. 1 seed.
