

AAAA group to set playoff field; Wednesday Pool schedule available Tuesday evening

The Veterans Division AAAA managers will meet Tuesday afternoon following the completion of their 4th pool game to discuss the make-up of the AAAA double-elimination playoffs, starting Thursday.

Veterans play began Sunday with 10 teams in the AAAA hunt. The managers will assist Roy Hobbs in determining the 8 teams advancing to AAAA playoffs. Those 8 teams get Wednesday off.

The 2 teams not making that playoff would play a 5th pool game Wednesday and move into the AAA or AA playoffs on Friday at the discretion of Roy Hobbs Baseball.

The Wednesday game pairings, times and field assignments for the general pool will be announced Tuesday evening at the Roy Hobbs Managers Reception at PDC.

The seeding and scheduling for Wednesdays games and the AAAA playoff games will be posted at World Series Headquarters at the Player Development Complex and be available on royhobbs.com/world-series.

RusStar Baseball back at RHWS, chasing medals

This is not fake news.

The RusStar Baseball Club has returned to the Roy Hobbs World Series after missing the 2017 event. RusStar has been a World Series fixture for many years but issues cropped up last year that could affect any team.

"A combination of things," Manager Igor Gribanovskiy said. "It was like some personal issues like divorce and also like financial crises."

Now, the Russians are back. How often has RusStar played here? Gribanovskiy estimated it's been 15 or 16 times.

The 9 Russians on the team endured a 12-hour flight from Moscow to Miami and then drove to Fort Myers. Their roster is supplemented with 5 Americans.

Although baseball is a minor sport in Russia it has taken a toehold in Moscow where a 16-team league exists, Gribanovskiy said. Two new fields have also opened in the past year.

"All fun," said Gribanosvskiy, who is the chief commercial officer for the Siberian Coal Energy Company. "We played just 2 weeks ago a best of 5 series and we lost 2-3."

Players from the teams that met in the finals are part of the team playing in the Veterans Division. RusStar opened play Sunday against the Baltimore Chop.

At practice Saturday several players wore T-shirts with these words: "Russian-American United Baseball Forces."

Any American attending a RusStar practice or game might hear words that sound familiar. Russians have directly transported the game's basic terms into their language. For example, a foul ball is called a foul ball and a double play is called a double play and so on.


In any language, their approach might sound familiar. "We're going to go as far as possible in the playoffs," Gribanovskiy, 46, said. "So we want some medals to be brought back. ... We have to be more focused now in strategy and use the pitching rotation in the right way. I think this time we have 5 guys who can pitch well, maybe not super level but pitch quite consistently."

A promising new player is Alxendr Vasilev, who recently hit 5 homers in a game. Now the word about Vasilev is out in *Inside Pitch*.

"Everyone is going to be scared of the Russian team," joked Veronika Ermilova, Gribinovskiy's girlfriend.

RusStar has yet to win a World Series title.

If anybody wants to wish RusStar good luck, the word for that in Russian is "udachi."

Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play.


AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, Open Division teams may have pitchers arrive Wednesday – those pitchers much throw 5 innings or 25 hitters to qualify for the playoffs.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

Managers should email a list of their qualified pitchers to Roy Hobbs in case of <u>rg@royhobbs.com</u> by 7 p.m. the night before their playoffs begin.



Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Playing site security

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, **AED devices** are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices.



Rick Winstead, Kodak Reds: RHWS has been a big part of our lives for the past 28 years (consecutively).

On our first day, of our first year we attended, we got to practice on the Kansas City Royals Stadium. As the Reds were walking out onto the field for batting practice, the song "Do you like Pina Coladas" was playing over the loud speakers. To this day, that song takes me back to That moment in 1991. Reds clean-up hitter, Doyle Clabo, hit the last pitch of practice out of the stadium, over the right field fence. THAT was our first

day with RHWS, and we've been hooked ever since.

Just as baseball does, we've had great games and great heartaches.

In 1997, the Kodak Reds were playing in their first RHWS championship game. The Reds took a 4-1 lead into the 9th inning. We had one out, and gave up a single, a double and an inside the park HR to tie the game. The Kodak Reds lost 6-5 in 12 innings.

Over the next 15 years, The Kodak Reds made the finals 6 more times only to lose. Four of those 6 games, the Reds took a lead into the 9th.

2015, we make the finals, during 45's week with RHWS. We have a 3½-hour lighting delay, the game is shortened to 7 innings; without lights we have to move from Jet Blue to Lee County Stadium. In the bottom of the seventh inning, what would have been the winning run, is thrown out at the plate; we were going to extra innings!

In the bottom of the 12th, the Canton Tigers lead off the inning with a triple. The Reds walked the next 2 batters to load the bases. With NO outs, bases loaded, the pitcher goes 3-0 on the next batter. Strike 1, Strike 2, a ground ball hit to third – what would have been the winning run for the Tigers is thrown out at the plate! The infield and outfield were playing in. The next batter pops out to the Reds centerfielder that was playing just behind second base. There are now two outs, everyone is back in their normal positions on the field. A soft fly to our shortstop ends the 12th. The Kodak Reds scored 4 runs in the top of the 13th half to win.

It took 25 years, a lighting delay, field change, and 13 exciting innings to win our first championship.
