The annual game is as much a Roy Hobbs Baseball tradition as games where the score is kept, championships are counted and matter a great deal to the participants.

Not on the fall Saturday when the Challenger game is played. The game is a bit different than the one Roy Hobbs players have played since boyhood.

The ball looks a bit like a baseball but is softer. The bases are set about the distance of bases on softball fields. There is never a case of three strikes and you're out in Challenger Baseball.

from their Naples home to a game just about every Saturday.

Debi Risch does the same from her Cape Coral home with her 18-year-old son Shane. He is in a wheelchair because of a genetic disorder, suffers from seizures and has autism.

Count Debi Risch as a Challenger Baseball fan.

"What's not to like about it?" Risch said before Saturday's game. "Seriously. The kids are socializing. The kids are making great friends. The parents are getting out of the house socializing, making friends and networking."

Everybody is welcome at Challenger. Nobody is judged.

"It doesn't matter if your kid is high functioning or low functioning," Risch said. "Shane is completely non-verbal. Yet he goes out there and has as much fun as the most highfunctioning kid."

Shane can't tell his mother he looks forward to the games and enjoys them, but she knows as only a mother could that he does.

"My philosophy is there is no reason for us to sit at home," Risch said. "There's no reason for him to sit at home."

Nobody.

Who won the Challenger game?

Everybody.



Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play.

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, Open Division teams may have pitchers arrive Wednesday – those pitchers much throw 5 innings or 25 hitters to qualify for the playoffs.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these non-qualified pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

Managers should email a list of their qualified pitchers to Roy Hobbs in case of rg@royhobbs.com by 7 p.m. the night before their playoffs begin.





Tom Allio, Kenmore Eastern

Brewers: When all the leaves have fallen in Northeast Ohio and a winter chill is in the air, there is no place I'd rather be than on the diamond in Fort Myers. For 28 years, I have come to this magical place to smell the fresh air, put my spikes in that orange dirt, put on "the tools of ignorance" and join my longtime

teammates in a week of which there is no comparison.

The Kenmore Eastern Brewers have played in every age group from 30 and over to our current status as a 65 and over team. Remarkably, 9 of us have been together for some 25 years! Despite a World Series Championship in 2016, we have lost more games than we have won. What we will never lose is the desire to compete to our full capacity, to laugh at our errors on the field, and to celebrate our longstanding friendships that are forever true and ageless. The Roy Hobbs World Series has given us this opportunity. It is more than a tournament to us. It is that safe space devoid of politics, sorrow, race, or economic status where men can become boys again.

RJ Bailey, Lehigh Baseball: In my town, there was no adult baseball, so if you wanted to play ball after high school or college, it had to be softball. Now that's okay, if that's all there is, but it isn't baseball. After 19 years of playing ball "in the Hobbs", the World Series is every bit as important to me as it was at that first inning of that first game back in 1999. Several years ago, we started our team, Lehigh Baseball, and since then, we are either playing in the Hobbs or talking about it. It remains a huge part of our lives. Hardly a day goes by that we don't think about how grateful we are for the impact Roy Hobbs Baseball has had on us.

John Berger, Kent Mudhens: When I first came to the RHWS, I remember how great it felt to play on major league quality fields where greats like Ruth, Speaker, Cobb, and Clemente played. Think of it! I was standing right where Babe Ruth stood. Since then, what keeps me coming back is so much more. It's the game itself, the camaraderie, the dugout experience, the teammates, and the friendships. I've met and played with teammates from Nashville, Spokane, Huntsville, and Chicago, just to mention a few. All of us playing the game we love and getting a chance to be kids

again. My favorite memory at RHWS is what my Mudhen teammates and I like to refer to as "the longest home run in Roy Hobbs history." I was catching, Don Bullock pitching, and the Baltimore Baseball's cleanup hitter was up in the

first inning with the bases loaded. He hit a home run at TP4 that cleared the high fence in right field and was last seen flying over Terry St. When Don got home, he received a package postmarked from Sanibel Island. Inside was a baseball with a message, "Found this on the beach, thought you'd like to have it back."

Brian Blevins, Orlando Blazers: There are so many things that come to mind when I think of the Roy Hobbs World Series. It's tough to write something like this without sounding like a Ken Burns retread, but the timeline of our lives is marked and distinguished by the annual fall pilgrimage to Ft. Myers. In no particular

order, I love being one of the first in the morning to the game site, with the grounds crew making final preparations, the sun peeking over the horizon of azure blue skies, and that familiar anticipation roiling in your gut. I've grown old, or older, to the incantations of that nice gentleman who asks if I would be interested in a 50/50 ticket, coming and going, no matter how many times I've walked by. He is my muse, he levels me, reminding me of my indistinguishable appearance. The fine folks of the Hobbs staff, and the cadre of dogs that lounge nearby, are a sure sign of games to be played.
