

24 hours in the air for a Baseball fix



Of the thousands of men and dozens of women who will participate in the 2018 Roy Hobbs World Series very few have likely traveled farther than Steve Mahoney of the Atlanta Astros.

No, he did not take a flight from Atlanta to Fort Myers.

Mahoney, who grew up in Scotch Plains, N.J., now resides in Singapore. The island city-state is on the southern tip of the Malay Peninsula and only about 1 degree north of the Equator. That's roughly 85 miles.

Fort Myers is at 26.6 degrees north and Atlanta is at 33.7 degrees. Scotch Plains, by the way, is at 40.6 degrees north.

His trip to his first Roy Hobbs World Series started with an 8-hour flight to Doha, Qatar and then a 16-hour direct flight to Miami. That's 24 hours in the air.

AAAA & close games will be completed

Roy Hobbs Baseball has determined that 4 games suspended by the rain on Sunday are final, and 11 games have been rescheduled.

The 3 night games that never started have been rescheduled. Two were played Monday night: *Boston Goodfellas at Bridgewater Cardinals and Dupage Indians at Ohio Indians*. The **Steel City Hawks** at **Lansing Blue Jays** game will be played Tuesday night at Terry Park 4, 5:30 p.m.

Three **AAAA pool games** were interrupted by rain; those will be completed Tuesday morning at JetBlue, field 1. Here is the schedule:

- 10 a.m. Massachusetts Chiefs at South Dakota Rushmores, suspended in the 6th.
- 11 a.m. Border City Brewers at Puerto Rico Orioles, suspended in the 7th.
- Noon Sacramento Royals at Minnesota Bees, suspended in 10th, tied.

All six teams will then move on to their regularly scheduled afternoon games.

The games that are finals are: **Kenmore Eastern Brewers** 7-3 over Lehigh Baseball; **Charlotte Kings** 6-3 over Tuscaloosa Tornados; **PSOF Rangers** 7-0 over Salem-Pitt Warlocks; and **St. Louis Braves** 13-8 over Kent Mudhens.

Other games being completed are: Legends Division:

- Kennebec Cubs at Bergen Yankees will be played Wednesday as part of a DH, with Bergen leading 6-5 in the 6th.
- **Banana Sharks at Omaha Indians:** Tuesday, 1 p.m. PDC2, following the Sharks 9:30 game at CP-S and before Omaha's 1:45 game at PDC2. Omaha is up 6-5 in the 8th.
- Huntsville Cardinals at St. Louis Grays: Tuesday, 5 p.m., CL-S, after both teams games at Centurylink and before Huntsville's 5:30 game at CL-S. Huntsville is leading 6-4 in the 9th.
- Summa Ortho Brewers at Nova Scotia Monarchs: Tuesday, 1:15 p.m. CSP-S, prior to 1:45 Monarch's stadium game and Brewers 1:45 p.m. CSP-1 game. Brewers leading 3-2 in 9th.

Vintage Division:

• Potomac Senators at Silver Foxes of Rhode Island: will be played Wednesday or Thursday as part of a Vintage DH. Game is tied in the 6th.

But it was worth it because Mahoney knew old friends from the Astros and a week of baseball awaited him.

"I love baseball," Mahoney said Sunday before his team played the Carolina Thunder at CenturyLink. "I play in Singapore and have been for the past three years."

He plays in a league with other Americans and players from South Korea, Japan and the Philippines. He said the games are played on an all-turf field at the American School. The competition includes games against a travel team of teenagers. His team is called the Xmen.

How did a guy from Scotch Plains and a finance major at Rutgers, wind up halfway across the world in Southeast Asia and just a tick above the Equator?

It was work related. He has been in Singapore for 3½ years as the Asian-Pacific region manager for Boehringer Ingelheim, one of the world's largest pharmaceutical companies. His work takes him to China, Japan, Thailand, South Korea, Australia and New Zealand.

He enjoys Singapore.

"Singapore is great," Mahoney said. "It's modern. It's safe. It's clean. The quality of life is fantastic and it's easy to travel around Asia."

Now he has traveled even farther to play baseball. The trip also gave him a chance to spend time with his son, Sean, a medical student in Miami.

Mahoney said his wife, Marijo, is supportive of his baseball. "She thinks I'm a little crazy," Mahoney said.

His Roy Hobbs week got off to a great start.

"He's the hero," said teammate Mike Stanford.

Mahoney had the go-ahead hit in the eighth-inning to give his team a 7-6 victory. That alone was likely worth 24 hours in the air.







Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play.

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, Open Division teams may have pitchers arrive Wednesday – those pitchers much throw 5 innings or 25 hitters to qualify for the playoffs.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

Managers should email a list of their qualified pitchers to Roy Hobbs in case of <u>rg@royhobbs.com</u> by 7 p.m. the night before their playoffs begin.


First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.
