Albany's RHWS decision 'a Capital idea'

Albany Capitals manager Mike Shurin was walking through CenturyLink following a game Monday afternoon in his team's first Roy Hobbs World Series.

Before the game, Shurin and players talked about how much they were enjoying their first trip to Fort Myers. As he lugged equipment bags, it was suggested to Shurin that signing up for the World Series was a "capital" idea.

Instead of groaning at a bad pun, Shurin laughed and said, "I guess you could say that."

The first Roy Hobbs World Series is a revelation for the Capitals. The weekend began with a visit to the PDC to register. It provided the Capitals a chance to see that venue's five fields, batting cages and meet staff.

Then came a doubleheader Sunday at JetBlue followed by Monday's game at CenturyLink.

"You don't get to play on these fields very often," Capital Stephen Schaefer said.

On the second day of the team's first World Series, Shurin was beaming.

"Loving it already," Shurin said.

He talked about the fields, staff friendliness and how venues are close to each other.

Shurin said the Capitals play in a large recreational league back home. Does he plan to tell folks in Albany about this event?

"Oh, absolutely," Shurin said.

Shurin has been posting World Series updates to a bulletin board for the Capital District Men's Senior Baseball League.

They lost on Monday but that was OK. "You guys played really hard today," Shurin told his team after the game.

Not only did they play hard, but they played in sunny weather a long way from freezing New York. The predicted high on Friday here at 26.6 degrees north latitude is 87 after a low of 69. In Albany at 42.6 degrees north latitude predictions call for a low of 20 and high of 38.

As players were filing out of their dugout and stowing away gear on Monday, Pat Alston said, "We got more baseball tomorrow."

Yes, they did.

They played the Windy City Warriors in Terry Park on Tuesday. The Warriors donned vintage baseball jerseys for Hall of Famers such as Babe Ruth, Jackie Robinson and Roberto Clemente. The Warriors assumed the persona of the legends and were introduced that way by public address announcer Richard Walega.

Although they lost 14-9 and dropped their record to 1-3, the Capitals still enjoyed the day and are thinking about returning in 2020.

Murphey 'Conman' launch is Monday

A book launch party for a baseball novel by veteran Roy Hobbs player Mike Murphey is scheduled for 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Monday at the PDC.

Murphey is playing this week with the Tuscaloosa Tornadoes. His novel, "The Conman," is based on the real baseball life of former big-league pitcher Keith Comstock, who contributed to the book.

Comstock, 63, will not be at the party but will speak via Skype. Murphey said he and Comstock have known each other for about 15 years and met through a Seattle Mariners' fantasy camp. Comstock plugged away in the minors starting in 1976 until 1984, when

he was called to the majors by the Twins. As Murphey got to know Comstock over the years he realized he is a unique figure with a compelling and amusing story.



"If he hadn't even a baseball player he could have been a success as a stand-up comedian," Murphey said.

From 1984 through 1991 Comstock compiled a 10-7 record with a 4.06 ERA with 3 saves as a reliever with the Giants, Twins, Padres and Mariners.

His fictional counterpart in the novel is a pitcher named Conor Nash. Hence, the title "The Conman."

The character is not a conman as in a grifter out to fleece people. The story, as Murphey explains, centers around Nash and three friends and his wife but is also filled with stories based on Comstock's long career.

Comstock is now the rehabilitation pitching coordinator for the Texas Rangers.

The book Launch event will be coupled with a managers' and players reception, including baseball eats, RH-logo Rocky Patel Cigars, wine, rum and beer.



Picking up T-Shirts ...

Players will need their RHWS ID card to get their shirts in person, no exceptions. No driver's licenses needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.


