# Saying Goodbye to City of Palms Park



Henry Leitner of the Silver Foxes didn't know City of Palms Park's rich history Wednesday as he chatted by the third base dugout on a sun-spangled fall day this week.

The Harvard computer science professor learned the park opened in 1993 and served as the Boston Red Sox spring training home from that year until 2011, the year before they moved to JetBlue.

"The Red Sox came here?" Leitner said in astonishment. "Wow!"

The Red Sox's first year in City of Palms Park was also the first year the Roy Hobbs World Series moved here from Orlando. It was serendipitous timing for the thousands of Roy Hobbs players who would over more than a quarter of a century troop into the charming ballpark fringed by royal palm trees.

This ballpark - with an old-time feel to it - has been the site of countless Roy Hobbs World Series games. This week that glorious era comes to an end as city of Fort Myers and Lee County officials move forward on plans to raze the park as part of a "mid-town" redevelopment effort in that part of the city.

As Leitner learned more he glanced up into the stands and excitedly told his wife, Catarina, some news.

"Nomar Garciaparra played here!" Leitner said, So did Henry Leitner.

And thousands of others.

In his famous 1960 New Yorker essay "Hub Fans Bid Kid Adieu" on Ted Williams' final game in Fenway Park, John Updike described that gem as "a lyric little bandbox of a ballpark."

That description also fits City of Palms Park.

"It has a lot of class," Leitner said. "Back home we have Fenway Park. This is how this feels. It has a lot of history. I don't know the history, but you can feel it."

Minnesota Goats Manager Vic Marotta recalls a trip to City of Palms when he reflected on the park's beauty.

"I sat here and thought how lucky we were to play in a place like this," Marotta said.

Melancholy might describe the mood these days at City of Palms.

"You're uprooting history," the Goats' Tom Flournoy said.

Roy Hobbs president Tom Giffen certainly knows the park's history. As he and his wife, Ellen, prepared and planned to move the World Series from central Florida to Fort Myers, they were able to see City of Palms under construction.

"We were in love with the park at first sight," Giffen said. "It's cozy with a throw-back feel, it's a great playing surface.

I have many good memories of playing there, including a couple of exhibition games against the Coors Silver Bullets."

Like many ballplayers in the years since, Giffen was able to pitch in the park. He vividly recalls a '96-'97 game against a Russian team when he spotted players bringing cases of beer into their dugout. Mid-batter, Giffen called "time" and more than suggested to the Russians that the beer was not a good idea and to take the beer and place it in a car in the parking lot

SouthWestern College baseball and softball teams, which compete on the JUCO level. Giffen said the park will remain in operation thru the end of FSW's season, probably into June of 2020.

Then?

"At that point, it's anybody's guess," he said. "Maybe we will squeeze one more World Series out of it, but I am not holding my breath."

That's the future.

When speaking of the ballpark's past, Brian Mullen likely knows more of that history than anybody. He was the official scorekeeper for every Red Sox spring training game played at the ballpark from 1993 through 2011.

"I'll feel bad when it's gone," said Mullen, the man




behind the name of the Roy Hobbs Brian Mullen Ambassador of Baseball Award. "I have a lot of great baseball memories there."

He won't be the only one who feels bad that City of Palms, that lyric little bandbox of a ballpark, is no more.

Giffen is not 100 percent sure of the park's fate but believes it will fall to the wrecking ball. "We've been told this is what will happen," he said.

The facility will remain open for several more months and serve as the baseball and softball homes of the Florida


