

These Spiders a far cry from 1899 Ohio namesake

The Cleveland Spiders are the worst team in baseball history.

Oh, to be clear, we don't mean the Cleveland Spiders who are playing in the Classics Division of the 2018 Roy Hobbs World Series.

The worst team in baseball history is the namesake and forefathers, so to speak, of the 2018 Spiders. That would be the 1899 Cleveland Spiders, who went 20-134 in the National League, finishing 84 games behind the first-place Brooklyn Superbas.

The 2018 Spiders know about their predecessors.

"I've done my research," Spider Pat Dolney said. "I think we're all probably aware that team existed."

But Dolney and his teammates likely didn't know the extent of the 1899 team's historic wretchedness.

The 19th century Spiders compiled a .130 winning percentage. To put that in perspective the 1962 Mets, widely considered the worst team ever, were 40-120 and had a .250 winning percentage.

The 1899 Spiders lost their seasonopened 10-1 to the St. Louis Perfectos. Everybody in Cleveland and all northeast Ohio likely knew the Spiders would be very bad.

This was the Cleveland Plain Dealer's headline after that game: "The Farce Has

Begun."

That headline was not fake news.

The 1899 Spiders didn't attract many more fans than attend Roy Hobbs games. Through the first 16 home games that year they attracted an average of 199 fans per game.

Those Spiders had some great names

 Highball Wilson, Kid Carsey, Crazy Schmitt and Sport McCallister.

Two pitchers combined for 52 losses. That would be Jim Hughey (4-30) and Charlie Knepper, who was 4-22.

At one point in 1899, the Spiders lost 24 consecutive games.

Dolney didn't know all that.

"I didn't do that much research," Dolney said.

The 2018 Spiders are doing a lot better.

"We changed all that when we won the championship," Manager Kim Carpenter said.

The 2018 Spiders won the Northeast Ohio Roy Hobbs title earlier this year, which is a big improvement over their performance at the 2017 World Series when they lost every game.

How did the 2018 World Series start?

"We lost the first game this year," Carpenter said with a laugh.

But they will never lose as much as the old-time Spiders. Their ancient and historically inept forefathers folded after the 1899 season. In 1901, Cleveland got another team, this one called the Blues in the start-up American League.

Fans now know that franchise as the Indians.

Hours to pick up the Tournament T-shirt are from Noon to 6 p.m. With the shirt, each player will get a tournament patch and a World Series Gift.


Players will need their RHWS ID card to get their shirts, no exceptions – No drivers licenses needed.

Broadcast plans

Roy Hobbs is working on a plan to broadcast selected World Series games, both live-streaming via the internet and as a posted post-game podcast on the Roy Hobbs website.

The immediate <u>goal for 2019</u> is to be able to offer teams the opportunity to have one of their games broadcast from Hammond Stadium at the Centurylink Complex. Teams buying into the plan – we would broadcast 2 games a day Sunday through Wednesday – would have their stadium game at Centurylink. Roy Hobbs would then broadcast 2 championship games each Saturday. We are talking broadcasting 48 games.





Please help with dugouts

Roy Hobbs Baseball and the grounds crews need your help in the dugouts.

When your games are over and you are leaving the dugout, please police it for trash and cups, etc. Your assistance in cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated. ••• ••• •••

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Customer Service

Roy Hobbs Baseball is proud of its record on customer service.

Staff members are required to wear identifying staff shirts during the working hours of the tournament and should be easily identifiable. At least two are assigned to each of the satellite complexes daily.

In the case of **emergency**, please go to the nearest concession stand at the satellite complexes, where someone will be available to summon help.

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, AED devices are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices.


