Anybody playing against the Kenmore Orioles this week who chats with certain players on this Ohio-based team might notice something right away.

It's not their appearance. It's their accents. Clinton Ball, David Chalkley and Glennis "Red" Hassell ain't from here. Not from Boston or Alabama or Minnesota. Or for that matter in this increasingly International event from the Dominican Republic or Canada or Ukraine.

"I'm an Australian," Hassell said Monday afternoon at JetBlue before the Orioles played the Chicago Colts.

How did these players from the far side of the globe and the other side of equator wind up in Fort Myers playing in the Roy Hobbs World Series?

Like their American counterparts they love the game and often look for tournaments. In 2016, Chalkley did a Google search for tournaments using the word "masters." Then somebody suggested he use the word "veterans."

It was a serendipitous suggestion.

He found a video on the Roy Hobbs Baseball web site showing the big-league facilities used during the World Series.

"As soon as I watched the video clip, we had to come," Chalkley said, Seeing JetBlue and CenturyLink and Terry Park was a revelation.

"There's nothing like this in Australia, that's for sure," Ball said.

Initially, they hoped to bring their entire team, the Demons. But the cost of the trip and other factors forced some teammates to abandon the idea. But Ball, Chalkley and Hassell still wanted to come. Arrangements were made through Roy Hobbs Baseball for them to play with the Orioles.

The Australians met their new teammates Saturday night, less than 24 hours before the first game on American soil.

Orioles manager Dante Sabatucci likes having them on his team.

"I think it's awesome," Sabatucci said. "Baseball is meant to be an international sport. And I'm hoping to learn something about how they play the game different down there."

Meanwhile, the Australians are soaking it all in.

"As an Australian, to play baseball in America is pretty big for us," Hassell said. "The birthplace of the sport."

Looking at the video clip is one thing but to actually walk into a baseball paradise such as JetBlue Park is quite another matter.

Just ask Liza Chalkley, David's wife. She was sitting in the bleachers at JetBlue Field No. 5 before Sunday's game.

"It's unbelievable," Liza Chalkley said. "The quality of fields. The number of fields. Never seen anything like it."

Welcome to America.

And welcome to the Roy Hobbs World Series.







Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play.

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, Open Division teams may have pitchers arrive Wednesday – those pitchers much throw 5 innings or 25 hitters to qualify for the playoffs.


Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-check in upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

Managers should email a list of their qualified pitchers to rg@royhobbs.com by 7 p.m. the night before their playoffs begin.

Please check the posted results and standings each day. Managers should contact Rob at the Tournament Headquarters (rg@royhobbs.com) with corrections to scores.

That's the best way to make sure that playoff seedings and pairings are as accurate as we can make them.

Customer Service

Roy Hobbs Baseball is proud of its record on customer service.

Staff members are required to wear identifying staff shirts during the working hours of the tournament and should be easily identifiable. At least two are assigned to each of the satellite complexes daily.

In the case of **emergency**, please go to the nearest concession stand at the satellite complexes, where someone will be available to summon help.

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, **AED devices** are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices.

Picking up T-Shirts

The tournament T-shirt is available **through Friday only** for all registered players outside the Roy Hobbs Store in the screened in patio at the Player Development Complex. **No Shirts will be given out on Thursday or Saturday.**

Hours to pick up the Tournament T-shirt are from Noon to 6 p.m. With the shirt, each player will also get a tournament patch.

person, no exceptions. No driver's licenses needed.

Please help with dugouts

Roy Hobbs Baseball and the grounds crews need your help in the dugouts.

When your games are over and you are leaving the dugout, please police it for trash and cups, etc. Your assistance in cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated.

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing and before you get to the field; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site, or the concessions person if closer. We do have the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Admission, \$1 a game

Admission continues at the Roy Hobbs World Series. Admission is \$1 per day or \$5 for a tournament pass.

Players will pay their \$1 at check-in for their player ID card that guarantees them access to all games in which they are not playing. Spectators will pay \$1 for entrance into each complex and are good for one day.

The \$5 tournament pass is available at RH Headquarters or from the Site Concierges at each security table; there is no family pass. The tournament pass is a plastic card that guarantees admission for that person for the duration of the RHWS. A loop comes with the tournament pass card for easy attachment to purses, belt loops, etc.
