The best player on the Puerto Rico Twins this week suits up but has not and will not play an inning.

Why?

A couple of reasons.

Jose Berrios is only 26.

Jose Berrios is a pitcher with the Minnesota Twins.

This week is about two things to Berrios - family and baseball. His uncle, Jose Angel Berrios, and older brother, Angel Berrios, are on the team. His wife and mother and three young children, between the ages of 3 and 6, are with him.

When Major League Baseball shut down because of the pandemic in the spring, Berrios retuned home to Puerto Rico. His uncle and old brother and teammates all provided support for him and a place to stay sharp.

Now, seven months into the pandemic, Berrios is in Fort Myers where the big-league Twins hold spring training.

The reason the right-handed Berrios, who has a 48-38 record in five big-league seasons, is here is basic.

"Because they're family," Berrios said.

Berrios took time to chat Sunday afternoon at JetBlue Park Field No. 3 after the Twins beat the Chicago Woodpeckers 5-1.

Sunday was his first day at the World Series and he was impressed by what he witnessed.

"I saw a lot of older, veteran guys who still love the game of baseball," Berrios said. "They come here to do what they love."

ability but are still skilled players.

"Ir's amazing," Berrios said. "You have to consider their age. They do a really nice job."

The team is now called the Puerto Rico Twins for an obvious reason - Berrios plays for the Minnesota Twins. Is he sponsoring the team?

"Not really," Berrios said. "I just came here to be myself." His uncle and older brother encouraged Berrios when he was a boy. He now encourages them. His uncle and brother don't speak English so Berrios translated their comments to Inside Pitch.

Berrios said his brother said, "I coached him and now he coaches me."

Berrios added that his brother said watches Jose pitch on TV.


"Still don't believe it," Berrios' brother said. "It's like a dream."

Berrios' uncle Jose Angel said of his nephew, "He did us proud."

Berrios' doesn't want to be considered a coach. In the ninth inning of Sunday's victory, Berrios visited the mound to encourage his pitcher.

"I didn't say anything about pitching," Berrios said.

What he has say this week is about family and friendship and baseball.







Welcome to RHWS 2020, COVID-19 19 Style

Welcome to 2020 Roy Hobbs World Series. We are glad you are here, but as you can see, this is a new day, a different day.

Our goal here at Roy Hobbs is for you to have a great time and to be safe here at this tournament.

With that in mind, here as some things we expect and are doing ...

- 1. All participants and patrons must show proof of a mask in their possession and get their temperature taken before entering any of the complexes we are using.
- 2. Players must have their player ID card in order to enter.
- Wearing masks is not mandated inside the complexes; however, it is required if social distancing – 3-4 feet outside – is not possible. Specific sites for masks will be stands, outside batting cages, the Pro Shop and offices.
- 4. We are providing game participants bottled water in the dugouts; please recycle.
- 5. Headquarters offices are outside the clubhouse on the lanai area; all are welcome. All meetings will be held outside.
- 6. Our CV19 protocols are on pages 9-15 of your event program and available at royhobbs.com.

End of the day, we want everyone to be safe, to be able to return home safely and whole.

Please remember, know the risks, avoid risks and practice **individual social responsibility**.

Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during first 4 games.

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, Open Division teams may have pitchers arrive Wednesday – those pitchers much throw 5 innings or 25 hitters to qualify for the playoffs.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS Monday/Tuesday to return on Thursday/Friday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-check-in upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.


Managers should email a list of their qualified pitchers to Rob Giffen <u>rg@royhobbs.com</u> the night before their playoffs begin.



out, please police it for trash and cups, etc. Your assistance in cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated.

• • •

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of water before and during the games; don't just wait until the game is starting. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed. If they are not readily available, the person in concessions can contact them.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. While we are allowing personal coolers this year, pitchers need to plan for ice for their arms and supply it.

Admission, \$1 a game

Admission continues at the Roy Hobbs World Series.

Admission is \$1 per game or \$5 for a tournament pass. Players will use their player ID card that guarantees them access to all sites whether they are playing or not. Non-player spectators will pay \$1 for entrance into each complex and are good for all sites for one day.

The \$5 tournament pass is available at RH Headquarters (PDC). There is no family pass, everyone 12 and up needs to have a pass. The tournament pass is a plastic card that guarantees admission for that person for the duration of the RHWS. A loop comes with the tournament pass card for easy attachment to purses, belt loops, etc.

Playing site security

The active steps taken several years ago to deal with parking lot security will continue as parking lot theft issues have – knock on wood – not been an issue the last 7 years.

Are we out of the woods? No, it is a daily procedure and effort to make sure parking lots are safe.

Once again, Roy Hobbs will have personnel posted at the player/spectators' entrances to Terry Park, PDC, JetBlue Complex.

These individuals will have a view of the parking lot, and they will be available in emergencies, be enforcing our pandemic protocols and handling admissions.

Customer Service

Roy Hobbs Baseball is proud of its record on customer service.

Staff members are required to wear identifying staff shirts during the working hours of the tournament and should be easily identifiable. At least two are assigned to each of the satellite complexes daily.

In the case of **emergency**, please go to the nearest concession stand at the satellite complexes, where someone will be available to summon help.

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, **AED devices** are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices as well.
