Oakville players embrace return to RHWS

Ray Kinsella: "No. ... it's Iowa."

Many who play in the Roy Hobbs World Series might quibble on the location of baseball paradise.

One is Greg McEachren of the Oakville Golden A's, a Canadian team. In 2020, the A's could not travel out of the country because of Covid restrictions.

But McEachren played with the Tidewater Drillers. As a parttime Fort Myers resident, he was already in the U.S. When he and his wife, Jennifer, bought a Fort Myers home he wanted one conveniently located for baseball.

"Right here in the middle of baseball heaven," McEachren, 61, said before a game at CenturyLink

From his Florida home, he said he is only 15 minutes or so

from every World Series ballpark.

Heaven, indeed.

The 2020 World Series wasn't heavenly for his friends on the Ontario-based A's.

"I missed the camaraderie, the teammates," McEachren said.

That's not a slight to the Drillers.

"I loved playing for the Drillers," McEachren said.

Meanwhile, the A's were back home not playing.

"They were jealous, envious, everything," McEachren said. They had encouraging words for their snowbird teammate

such as "Go get 'em. Best of of luck. All that sort of thing." He and his wife have settled comfortably into an active Flor-

ida lifestyle. She runs marathons. Does Greg run marathons? "I run 90 feet at a time and turn left," said McEachren, who

also plays pickle ball and squash.

Covid restrictions cut short the 2020 Canadian baseball season.

"We couldn't get park permits until the end of June," said Al Rutherford of the A's, who is now a British Columbia resident.

Canadian senior baseball events were canceled for two years, according to Rutherford. When games were played, umpires had to call balls and strikes from behind the mound. "We haven't had a chance to go and defend our national championship," Rutherford said.


A's manager Rich Knight said his team is the host for the Canadian senior baseball championships, but the event was not held last year or this year. Of course, there wasn't the Florida trip last year.

"The guys were really unhappy we couldn't go," Knight said, "But everyone understood."


A challenge for the A's were travel restrictions. Knight said people coming back into Canada had to quarantine for 14 days. In essence, then, players had to take three weeks off at a time if they wanted to come to Fort Myers. That would be a week here and then two weeks in quarantine. "They had families and they didn't want to take three weeks," Knight said,

It's now 2021 and the A's are back, back in heaven.


The second of 2021's two events is this coming Saturday at Ron Dao's Sports Grill at 15320 McGregor Blvd, en route to the beach.

First Aid

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.


