It Seems All Pucketts Find Baseball Eventually

The name Kirby Puckett Jr. likely jumps off every lineup card at the Roy Hobbs World Series.

How many Roy Hobbs players are sons of Hall of Famers and carry Jr. in their name? Kirby Puckett Jr., is likely the only one.

His father died after a stroke in 2006 at the age of 45. Puckett's career ended in spring training in Fort Myers in 1996 when the Minnesota Twins centerfielder was diagnosed with glaucoma.

Junior is only 31. His father's career ended when he was toddler and he was only 13 when he died. Puckett, Jr. did not grow up playing baseball. He was a basketball and football guy,

But earlier this year he attended a Twins fantasy camp at a facility his father played in from 1991 through 1996. His coaches included former Twins Al Newman, Gene Larkin, Tommy Watkins and Jacque Jones.

"I wish my dad could have been at the fantasy camp," Puckett Jr. said.

Dad didn't pressure his son to play baseball.

"He told me to do anything," said Puckett Jr., who moved with his wife, Hailee, and 1-year-old son, Kirby Puckett III, to Fort Myers last week from Minnesota. "Don't do anything you don't want to do."

It was only in the past couple of years that baseball was one of those things. The fantasy camp triggered interest. It took one day at the Roy Hobbs World Se-

ries for Puckett, Jr. to see a difference between fantasy camps and Roy Hobbs.

"There's a big difference," Puckett, Jr. said. "I would say the competition is a little bit better here because of the age difference."

It was at the fantasy camp that umpire Igor Negron, who plays and coaches for the Chicago Knights, met Puckett Jr. He noticed how Puckett, Jr. invariably said "yes, sir" or "no, sir" when older people talked to him. He seemed like a good fit for the Knights.

"The playing part was kind of second," Negron said. It was a character reference from Negron that convinced Knights manager Bob Dearth to sign up the inexperienced baseball player.

"He (Negron) said, 'Bob, he's one of the nicest kids you'll ever meet, respectful, solid player, of course," Dearth said.

What if Kirby Puckett saw his son playing now?

"He'd be surprised because I didn't grow up playing baseball," Puckett Jr. said. If he could ask his father about playing in the Roy Hobbs World Series, he expects he would say go for it.

And, Kirby Puckett, Jr is doing just that.





Score Reporting

There is a QR code posted in every dugout that we will be using. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form.

Playing site security

The active steps taken several years ago to deal with parking lot security will continue as parking lot theft issues have – knock on wood – not been an issue the last 7 years.
