Doney Brings Experience and Laughter to Bandits

Bruce Doney of the Minnesota Bandits is a retired police officer who jokes that he is a cop by day and a Bandit by night.

There is plenty of Banditry on Doney's schedule this fall. This is the first of four weeks and five age divisions of the Roy Hobbs World Series for the 71-year-old. He's in the 45-plus Masters this week and will stick around for the 53s, 60s, 65s and 70s.

The 2022 Roy Hobbs Hall of Fame honoree said he's been doing four weeks since he was a mere lad of 65.

The retired Wright County (Minn.) deputy and paramedic was born in 1952 and wears No. 52.

How long ago was he born? In 1952, there were only 16 big-league teams. The Twins were still the Senators and

based in Washington. The Dodgers were in Brooklyn and the Giants in New York and the A's in Philadelphia.

Yet, Doney plays on.

He brings more than experience to the Bandits.

"A lot of laughs," said Bandits manager Tim Doboszenski, who believes the two started playing together in 1998 or 1999.

Teammate Terry Knop echoes his manager about what makes Doney an excellent teammate.

"His sense of humor," said Knop, who pointed out his own last name is a four-letter word. "We have a ton of fun."

For Knop, a treat for playing on the Bandits is Doney's self-deprecating humor regarding his own foibles. Knop should know. They've been teammates for 24 years.

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"He'll say, 'What in the world did I do that for?" Doney said. "And then he'll answer."

Knop's description of Doney makes his on-field self-talk sound like 1970s pitcher Mark Fidrych.

"Yes!" Knop said. "A lot of the same self-conversation. Talks himself into a lot of things."

This week Doney is spending more time coaching than playing.

He certainly knows his way around the World Series and Lee County. Doney started playing in the event in 1994.

Doney, who resides in Delano, Minn., will be formally inducted into the Hall of Fame on Nov. 4.

"Very humbling because I don't do this for recognition," Doney said.

What does he do it for?

"Because it's fun," Doney said.

Doney hopes to continue having baseball fun for many years. There are men in their 80s still playing.

Does Bruce Doney, the cop and Bandit, see himself still playing at that age?

"God willing," Doney said.






Who needs an umpire? Dayton Wolves baserunner calls himself safe vs. the Tidewater Drillers. He was right.



There is a QR code posted in every dugout that we will be using. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form.

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easily identifiable. At least two are assigned to each of the satellite complexes daily.

In the case of **emergency**, please go to the nearest concession stand at the satellite complexes, where someone will be available to summon help.

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, **AED devices** are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices.

Playing Site Security

The active steps taken several years ago to deal with parking lot security will continue as parking lot theft issues have – knock on wood – not been an issue the last 7 years.

Are we out of the woods? No, it is a daily procedure and effort to make sure parking lots are safe.

Once again, Roy Hobbs will have personnel posted at the player/spectators' entrances to Terry Park, PDC, JetBlue Complex and at the entrance to the Quad fields at Lee County.

These individuals will have a view of the parking lot, and they will be available in emergencies, be enforcing cooler guidelines and handling admissions.

Admission, \$1 A Day

Admission continues at the Roy Hobbs World Series.

Admission is \$1 per game or \$6 for a tournament pass. The player ID card grants players access to all games in which

they are not playing. Spectators will pay \$1 for entrance into each complex and are good for one day.

The \$6 tournament pass is available at RH Headquarters or from the Site Concierges at each security table; there is no family pass. The tournament pass is a plastic card that guarantees admission for that person for the duration of the RHWS. A loop comes with the tournament pass card for easy attachment to purses, beltloops, etc.

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

RH Label Cigars

RH Label cigars are available at PDC headquarters from the Roy Hobbs Geezer.

Cost: \$6 each or 5 for \$25.

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Player Pairings Party

Sidelines Sports Bar and Grill (4451 Veronica Shoemaker Blvd) is hosting our Player Party to announce playoff information. We will be ready for players to arrive starting at 6:30. We will have raffle prizes for all players and their wives/ guests. The playoff pairings will be announced approximately 7:15 PM.

Playoff Pitching Guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings - 6 outs or 10 hitters - during pool play, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they check-in after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters).

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these non-qualified pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

That's the best way to make sure that playoff seedings and pairings are as accurate as we can make them.
