

No Distance Is Too Far for the Love of Baseball

Morning dew still glistened on the infield of JetBlue Field No. 3 Sunday morning. The stadium shimmered and gleamed over the right-field wall. The sun sparkled off of grass and glass and aluminum.

Sitting in the bleachers was Danny Rodriguez of the USVI Hurricanes, unable to play because of a knee injury.

But he didn't sound depressed. Far from it.

"Just take a deep breath," Rodriguez said. "It just smells like baseball. Oh, yeah, it's a great day to be alive."

Like many Roy Hobbs players, Rodriguez and his teammates traveled a long way to play in the Roy Hobbs World Series.

The four letters in the team name stand for United States Virgin Islands, which are southeast of Puerto Rico. There was a flight to Florida for most of the team. Three members of the team are Mexican and drove to Fort Myers. They drove straight through, taking turns driving.

Team manager Dhario Linares is from the Dominican Republic. The roster is rounded out by a free agent from North Carolina named David Navarro.

It's a testament to their love of the game that the players journeyed here. The three Mexicans - Solomon Lopez, Victor Herrera and Oscar Tirado - are from the northeastern city of Saltillo. Google Maps estimated the distance from their city to Jet Blue at 1,800 miles and pegs the driving time at 27 hours.

Lopez served as the Mexican spokesman with Linares and Rodriguez translating. He said he found the people at

the Roy Hobbs World Series warm and the fields perfect.

The Virgin Islands don't have the same baseball history as other Caribbean locales such as Cuba, Puerto Rico, the Dominican Republic and Curacao.

But players from the islands such as Joe Christopher, Horace Clarke, Al McBean, Elrod Hendricks, Midre Cumming and others have played in the majors.

Christopher, McBean and Cummings spent part of their careers in Fort Myers for spring training. Christopher and McBean were with the Pirates when they trained at Terry Park. Cummings played for the Twins and Red Sox and stepped on PDC and Lee County Sports Complex diamonds.

There are no comparable facilities in the Virgin Islands, according to Rodriguez. He said the team doesn't play games back home because of sub-par facilities but does practice.

"The lights are pointed in all kinds of directions," said Rodriguez, a retired police officer.

A new facility is under construction that he hopes will spark interest in baseball.

Maybe the new facility will smell like baseball.







Roy Hobbs Baseball is proud of its record on customer service.

Staff members are required to wear identifying staff shirts during the working hours of the tournament and should be easily identifiable. At least two are assigned to each of the satellite complexes daily.

In the case of emergency, please go to the nearest concession stand at the satellite complexes, where someone will be available to summon help.

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, AED devices are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices.

Playing Site Security

The active steps taken several years ago to deal with parking lot security will continue as parking lot theft issues have - knock on wood - not been an issue the last 7 years.

Are we out of the woods? No, it is a daily procedure and effort to make sure parking lots are safe.

Admission, SI A Day

Admission continues at the Roy Hobbs World Series.

Admission is \$1 per game or \$6 for a tournament pass. The player ID card grants players access to all games in which they are not playing. Spectators will pay \$1 for entrance into each complex and are good for one day.

The \$6 tournament pass is available at RH Headquarters or from the Site Concierges at each security table; there is no family pass. The tournament pass is a plastic card that guarantees admission for that person for the duration of the RHWS. A loop comes with the tournament pass card for easy attachment to purses, beltloops, etc.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

RH Label Cigars

RH Label cigars are available at PDC headquarters from the Roy Hobbs Geezer.

Playoff Pitching Guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they check-in after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters).

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

That's the best way to make sure that playoff seedings and pairings are as accurate as we can make them.
