# Hal Young Is a Miracle on the Mound

A sunny November morning in 2021 at CenturyLink Field No. 4 was the site of one of the scariest moments in Roy Hobbs World Series history.

Hal Young, a 73-year-old pitcher for the Sacramento Solons, keeled over with a heart attack. Teammates saw him turning blue on the green grass of the ball field. CPR was administered. Paramedics were summoned. Paddles were attached to his chest to jolt his heart back into action and that surge lifted him off the ground.

It was scary, to say the least.

"We were walking around like lost sheep," teammate Pat Kelly said Wednesday at JetBlue.

Now, two years later, Young is back. He's back with the Sacramento Buzzards. He's back playing baseball with his friends. He's back pitching.

Teammates then and now know how close they came to losing Young.

"He was dead a week ago," catcher Jeff Heatherington said two years ago just a few days after the incident.

His recovery was termed "The Miracle on the Mound" two years ago by Diana Ropke, the wife of teammate Lanny Ropke.

Young was transported by ambulance to nearby Gulf Coast Medical Center. Then, about three weeks later, he underwent a quadruple bypass procedure.

Even during the week of the heart attack and before the bypass, Young was already thinking about baseball.

"My main goal is to get clearance to start conditioning," Young said from his hospital bed in 2021.

On Wednesday, instead of sitting in a hospital bed wearing a medical gown, Young was in a Buzzards uniform and sitting at a picnic table before a game at JetBlue.

He was on his way back to playing ball shortly after the bypass in November of 2021. By the following January, he was working out in a gym. He wasn't able to do the cardio and weights like before but he was on his way back.

He was on his way back from the brink. Young knows what

teammates were thinking two years ago when the ambulance pulled away slowly from the ball field.

"They thought maybe they hadn't revived me," Young said.

Clearly, he was revived. The journey back to the mound began with light tossing of a tennis ball and walks in February of 2022. He ramped up activity and as he recalls by May or June of last year was playing.

Now, two years later, Hal Young is back in the Roy Hobbs World Series and back pitching.

"You can't write the script any better," Kelly said.

Indeed, this might be dubbed Miracle on the Mound, The Return.

### Hobbs family to honor Veterans Saturday & Sunday

Veterans Day is Saturday, November 11, a date Roy Hobbs reveres annually.

Roy Hobbs is honoring Veterans at its games on Saturday at 60s/70s playoff games and then again on Sunday, the first day of 65s and 75s play.

At each game, we ask the players on both teams to line up on the baselines for a moment of silence to honor veterans. Umpires usually act as "masters" of the ceremonies, and each handles it differently. If someone wants to speak, please speak up. This is an important remembrance and many veterans are playing this week.

At PDC, Jim Doepke, who has played taps at Arlington National Cemetery, will play taps on his trumpet in honor of Veterans Day at 9:45 a.m. Players will be lined up on the baselines and Jim will be stationed in the Tower at the center of the Quad to play.

Doepke, a retired high school band director from Wisconsin, who has played his trumpet at all MLB parks and numerous colleges, is in his fifth year playing at one Saturday championship game a week at the Roy Hobbs World Series as well as honoring Veterans Day.

#### Please help with dugouts

Roy Hobbs Baseball and the grounds crews need your help in the dugouts.

When your games are over and you are leaving the dugout, please police it for trash and cups, etc. Your assistance in cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated.

#### **First Aid**

**Two key First Aid items:** Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.
