Strachan's Family Connection to Baseball History

Roy Hobbs Baseball helped Glenn Strachan solve a family mystery this past summer. The detective work also opened a window into how Strachan, now 66 and playing for the DC Mets, destroyed baseball treasures as a boy.

When he was about 8, Strachan played in the street in front of his Long Island home with baseballs signed by the entire 1927, 1928 and 1929 Yankees. Yes, those Yankees. Yes, Hall of Famers such as Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig and Herb Pennock, who is a third cousin of Strachan.

That's how the baseballs ended up gathering dust on a mantle in the family home in Wantagh, N.Y.

First, the mystery. ...

Strachan sent Roy Hobbs Baseball a photo of his mother, Elaine, when she was about 6 standing next to a man wearing

a baseball uniform and sitting in bleachers. The man in the photo was Hall of Fame centerfielder Tris Speaker, then the manager of the minor-league Newark Bears.

"I called my brother and said it's Tris Speaker," Strachan said Saturday morning sitting at a picnic table at the PDC. "Then, he goes no way."

They looked at photos of Speaker for confirmation.

Speaker is still considered one of the greatest centerfielders ever. In 2016, ESPN ranked him No. 7 all-time. In historian Bill James' 2001 "The New Bill James Historical Baseball Abstract," Speaker is No. 4, just after Willie Mays, Ty Cobb and Mickey Mantle.

What about the baseballs? Strachan said his father took the destruction in stride but his mother, whose maiden name was Pennock, was angry.

"She said your grandmother is going to find out about this," Strachan said. "I'm like, Oh, my, God, what have I done?" What happened?

"It's a blur," Strachan said of events nearly 60 years ago. "You remember when you were a kid and that sense of impending doom? ... So, three million bucks down the drain."

Actually, the going rate for the baseball signed by the 1927 Yankees is not that high.

Some details remain of the episode.

"I remember seeing remnants of the signatures on one of the balls," Strachan said.

When Strachan isn't playing baseball, he is the chief IT officer at Johns Hopkins University in Maryland.

Speaker, by the way, was such a phenomenal ballplayer that when he was in his 40s he played for the Bears.

In 1929, at age 41, he appeared in 46 games and hit .355 with 11 doubles, a triple and a homer. The following year at 42, he played in 11 games and hit .419.

Pennock died at 53 in 1948. The cause of death was either a heart attack, stroke or cerebral hemorrhage. Different sources list different causes.

Strachan is also a pitcher but he knows he's not on the same level as Pennock.

"There's no comparison," Strachan said of pitching ability. "I'm still pitching at 66. He was dead."





Playoff Pitching and Check-In Guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during your first 4 games, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they checkin after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters) on Tuesday or Wednesday.

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes(first 4); however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the Friday quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.


There is a QR code posted in every dugout that we will be using. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form.

cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated.

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Admission, \$1 A Day

Admission continues at the Roy Hobbs World Series.

Admission is \$1 per game or \$6 for a tournament pass. The player ID card grants players access to all games in which they are not playing. Spectators will pay \$1 for entrance into each

complex and are good for one day.

The \$6 tournament pass is available at RH Headquarters or from the Site Concierges at each security table; there is no family pass. The tournament pass is a plastic card that guarantees admission for that person for the duration of the RHWS. A loop comes with the tournament pass card for easy attachment to purses, beltloops, etc.

Customer Service

Roy Hobbs Baseball is proud of its record on customer service.

Staff members are required to wear identifying staff shirts during the working hours of the tournament and should be easily identifiable. At least two are assigned to each of the satellite complexes daily.

In the case of **emergency**, please go to the nearest concession stand at the satellite complexes, where someone will be available to summon help.

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, **AED devices** are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices.

Playing Site Security

The active steps taken several years ago to deal with parking lot security will continue as parking lot theft issues have – knock on wood – not been an issue the last 7 years.

Are we out of the woods? No, it is a daily procedure and effort to make sure parking lots are safe.

Once again, Roy Hobbs will have personnel posted at the player/spectators' entrances to Terry Park, PDC, JetBlue Complex and at the entrance to the Quad fields at Lee County.

These individuals will have a view of the parking lot, and they will be available in emergencies, be enforcing cooler guidelines and handling admissions.
