

Carroll 'Woody" Wood's Heart Attack Comeback

Several weeks before the Roy Hobbs World Series a heart transplant seemed the only hope for Carroll Wood of the St. Louis Patriots.

Play baseball again? Play in 2023? Run? Throw? Field? Hang in the dugout with his Patriot buddies?

All seemed out of the question for the man known as Woody. Yet, here in mid-November, Carroll, 65, is playing.

Not too long ago, according to his wife, Lisa, simply walking from a dugout at a JetBlue back field to the restroom would have been too taxing.

The trouble began about a year ago, about the time Hurricane lan cancelled the 2022 World Series. Wood doesn't know when he had the heart attack but he and Lisa were told he had one.

And it was serious.

"It was a widow-maker for sure," Patriots teammate Don Short said.

Lisa is obviously not a widow. She attends Woody's game and traveled here with her husband from their Missouri home.

Short said his friend died but was brought back with shocks from a defibrillator. Although revived, his heart was damaged.

"The doctor said if we don't put you on the transplant list you're going to die," Short said.

Before proceeding to the transplant, though, doctors adjusted Wood's pacemaker and medication. That made all the difference. Wood felt better almost instantly and started walking a couple of miles a day. He was encouraged to join the team for practices.

"They fixed me over night," Wood said.

He said that was in mid-September.

Wood traces his heart troubles to the fall of 2022. Although the World Series was cancelled he and Lisa still planned to come to Florida to visit their daughter, Carrissa, who resides in Melbourne on Florida's east coast.

Through the drive from Missouri. Wood said he was coughing "all the way." At Lisa's urging he visited an urgent care facility in Melbourne. The initial diagnosis, he said, was bronchitis.

"We just figured he had a virus or something," Lisa said. He was given medication for that. It didn't help.

They returned to urgent care. That's where a man Carroll said was an "EMT" did additional tests.

"He said, 'I think you had a heart attack," Carroll said. The next stop was a hospital, where it was confirmed that



at some point Carroll had a heart attack. He was given bad news.

"A lot of my heart died," Carroll said.

Woody and Lisa were told he wasn't "having" a heart attack. "He'd had a heart attack," Lisa said.

They couldn't pinpoint a date for the attack.

He was admitted to the hospital and said that he coded.

"I think that night they also had to jump on me and bring me back," Carroll said.

A defibrillator jolted his heart back to working. The next day a pacemaker was installed. He and Lisa spent Thanksgiv-

ing 2022 at their daughter's Melbourne home.

"I was in awful shape," Wood said. "I couldn't eat. Couldn't keep anything down. Couldn't sleep."

He had chest pains that sent jolts through him. An ambulance was called. He was back in the hospital. He estimates 13 times in three hours he was jolted by pain.

"It was like laying on the ground and me hitting you as hard as I can in the chest with a bat," Wood said.

He spent about three weeks in the hospital.

"The plan was to get a heart transplant," Wood said. "It blew me away."

Just getting up to go to the bathroom was a challenge.

"I had breathing problems every night," Wood said.

But the September adjustment to the pacemaker and medication allowed the return to baseball. He started conditioning. He returned to game action on Sunday.

"I don't think I've ever been as nervous about an at-bat in my entire life," Wood said.

More than nervous.

"I've been playing since I was 9 and never been scared," Wood said.

But he was now.

And he wasn't worried about getting hit by a pitch. "Am I going to die?" Wood said.

This man who had been on the brink of death and was being considered for a heart transplant was hit by a pitch in his first at-bat. But not in the chest.

"In the butt," Wood said.

He now plays wearing a kevlar chest protector. He doesn't need it for his butt.

On Sunday, his fear was at a 10 on a 1-to-10 scale. By Tuesday, the fear had settled down to an 8.

Through the ordeal, Wood said he dropped 42 pounds and now weighs about 140. But he's gained something, He's gained a way back to his life and wife and children and grandchildren and teammates. The comeback is about more than a game or who won or lost.

"Ultimately, you're out here with with your buddies," Wood said. "You're out here to make memories.

Woody is back in baseball.

"He's like a kid on Christmas morning," Lisa said.





When your games are over and you are leaving the dugout, please police it for trash and cups, etc. Your assistance in cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated.


Playing site security
