Elias Attending His 34th Roy Hobbs World Series

Steve Elias is a Roy Hobbs World Series pioneer, one of a handful of men who played in the inaugural event in 1989 and has never missed.

He's now 76. In 1989, he was a mere lad of 42 when he traveled to Haines City in central Florida for the first World Series.

Through the 1990s, 2000s, 2010s and now the 2020s, he's played. This year he's with the Wilmington Thunder. It is his 34th World Series.

"This is the highlight of my life," Elias said Monday morning at the Lee County Sports Complex.

Who else is in this select company of having spent more than a third of a century coming to the World Series? The list likely includes Troy Cox and Dave Mathews, who are here this year.

In 2018 at the 30th World Series, a story focused on the men who had been to the first 30 World Series. Even then the list was short and included Fran Podraza, Daryl Miller and Harvey Swisher.

Elias credits his wife of 54 years, Linda, with helping makes this possible. She's made most of the 34 World Series trips.

"Because she loves the game as much as I do," said Elias, who resides in Myrtle Beach, S.C.

Linda understands what baseball does for Steve.

"It keeps him young," Linda said. "This is Forever Young. It really is."

Mathews, 79, also played at the Lee County Sports Complex on Monday. Coming here is a big commitment for the resident of Gig Harbor, Wash. He flies from the Great Northwest to Southwest Florida.

One of the treats of playing on the Titans for Mathews is being surrounded by talented teammates.



"I think I'm a pretty good player," Mathews said. "I think there is not a guy on the team that isn't better than I am."

The first World Series was a venture into the unknown.

"We didn't know what to expect," Elias said. "Some of the teams were stacked with ex-major league players."

But the event has never been about the pros. It's about teammates and camaraderie.


"The most important thing is meeting with all the players," Elias said. ""Not only your own teammates but players from other teams."

He talked about the "sad part" of reading In Memoriam notices from Roy Hobbs Baseball. But the World Seres and Elias live on.

Seeing the same faces over the years means a great deal.

"As old as we get, it's quite an honor to play with these guys," Elias said.



Playoff Pitching and check-in Guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during your first 4 games, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they checkin after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters) on Tuesday or Wednesday.

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes(first 4); however, AAAA teams may

bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the Friday quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

Roy Hobbs Baseball and the grounds crews need your help in the dugouts.

When your games are over and you are leaving the dugout, please police it for trash and cups, etc. Your assistance in cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated.

Please check the posted results and standings each day. Managers should contact Rob at the Tournament Headquarters (330.352.2175) with corrections to scores.

That's the best way to make sure that playoff seedings and pairings are as accurate as we can make them.

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Score Reporting

There is a QR code posted in every dugout that we will be using. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form.

Customer Service

Roy Hobbs Baseball is proud of its record on customer service.

Staff members are required to wear identifying staff shirts during the working hours of the tournament and should be easily identifiable. At least two are assigned to each of the satellite complexes daily.

In the case of **emergency**, please go to the nearest concession stand at the satellite complexes, where someone

will be available to summon help.

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, **AED devices** are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices.

Playing site security

The active steps taken several years ago to deal with parking lot security will continue as parking lot theft issues have – knock on wood – not been an issue the last 7 years.

Are we out of the woods? No, it is a daily procedure and effort to make sure parking lots are safe.

Once again, Roy Hobbs will have personnel posted at the player/spectators' entrances to Terry Park, PDC, JetBlue Complex and at the entrance to the Quad fields at Lee County.

These individuals will have a view of the parking lot, and they will be available in emergencies, be enforcing cooler guidelines and handling admissions.

RH Label cigars are available at PDC headquarters from the Roy Hobbs Geezer.
