

Limeport's Milkmen deliver at RHWS

Roy Hobbs Baseball The Limeport Milkmen deliver.

They don't deliver quarts of cold milk in glass bottles the way milkmen used to do.

They deliver a chance to play baseball in Pennsylvania's Lehigh Valley and Fort Myers.

They also delivered history lessons this week at the Roy Hobbs World Series about the origins of their team name and a place called Limeport Stadium. That stadium is nearly as old as Terry Park.

Limeport Stadium was built in 1933, only eight years after Terry Park became the spring training home of the Philadelphia A's.

"It reminds me of Terry Park," Milkman Chad Arnold said Tuesday, sitting in the bleachers at Terry Park Field No. 2.

Although Limeport Stadium has never been used for pro baseball it has a rich history of amateur ball.

The Milkmen uniform pays tribute to what the original Milkmen wore but with one key difference. The original was wool. The 2024 Milkmen do not wear wool.

The team name also pays homage to the Lehigh Val-

ley's dairy industry and to an old-time semi-pro team that played home games in Limeport Stadium.

Limeport Stadium was built during the Depression. The project provided jobs for unemployed workers when jobs were scarce.

Limeport's centerfield wall is 485 feet away and up a slope.



A boulder is in deep center and remains there because during construction it was deemed too expensive to get out. Dirt was filled in around it.

Local legend around Limeport holds that only one player ever hit a ball over the centerfield wall. His name was Alex Sabo, a former Fordham football and baseball player who played briefly with the Washington Senators.

How briefly? He played in five games over the 1936 and 1937 seasons and was 3-for-8 with no homers. His historic Limeport homer was hit in 1947.

Another Limeport Stadium legend includes the resting place of a hunting beagle that belonged to dairy farmer Howard "Lefty" Fegely, the man behind the stadium. The dog is buried under third base.

The beagle's name is unknown to the modern Milkmen and is not mentioned on the stadium website or in an account of the stadium history by a newspaper.

A story by Chuck Hixson on timesnewsonline.com noted that the grandstand was designed to match that of

Connie Mack Stadium in Philadelphia.

That is a connection to Fort Myers. Connie Mack managed the A's when they held spring training at Terry Park from 1925 to 1936.

What Fegely created more than 90 years ago lives on now in Florida with the Limeport Milkmen.

It's a baseball story that never sours.



Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they check-in after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters).

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

Score Reporting

There is a QR code posted in every dugout that we will be using. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form, which includes places for your Player of the Game and your umpire evaluations.

Results corrections

Please check the posted results and standings each day. Managers should contact Rob at the Tournament Headquarters (234.200.8449) with corrections to scores.

That's the best way to make sure that playoff seedings and pairings are as accurate as we can make them.

Run-rule games

Run rule is 10 runs at 7 complete innings or if home team is ahead in a scheduled 9-inning game. Scheduled 7-inning games are 15 at 5 innings.

Now, in a 9-inning game, if the score difference is 15 at 5 innings, umpires have been instructed to call both managers together and to offer the team on the short end of the score if they want 6 outs to bat.

As far as RH is concerned the team ahead has won, but any runs scored will count in RA, so that is an incentive to not just put anyone out there to pitch.


Both teams must agree.
