# Former figure skater now hitting fastballs

Tom Jasper's baseball and figure skating journey may be unique in Roy Hobbs World Series history.

As a boy growing up in the Chicago suburbs his father imagined him someday playing second base for the Cubs, just like young Tommy's favorite player, Ryne Sandberg.

But the boy quit baseball at the age of 12 to focus on figure skating. He returned to baseball seven years ago.

"I was hooked immediately," Jasper said Sunday, sitting at a picnic table at Terry Park.

This is his second World Series. He plays for the Clearwater Rays and revels in being part of a team after competing in singles figure skating.

"I just love team sports," Jasper said. "There's nothing like it. I enjoy success with my team more than I did on my own."

The Marine Corps lieutenant colonel, 54, plays centerfield and bats leadoff. Many Roy Hobbs players have athletic background in sports such as football, basketball, track and wrestling.

But not figure skating.

Young Tom Jasper devoted himself to the sport, practicing six hours and competed on a national level. A Google search shows he finished seventh in the novice division at the 1986 nationals and 12th in the junior men's division in 1987.

Jasper competed in the 1988 U.S. Olympic Trials in juniors and placed 13th. Brian Boitano was first in the men's division and went on to win Gold at 1988 Olympics in Calgary.

Jasper quit skating at the age of 20 after injuries and focused on education and his military career. But he was always an athlete, playing racquetball among other sports. Jasper doesn't know of any other figure skaters who play baseball or became Marine Corps officers.

"Truthfully, I think figure skating training is harder than Marine Corps training to be honest with you," Jasper said. "Six hours a day of jumping, skating, falling, getting back up."

Routines are four-minutes long.

"So, the Marine Corps training was kind of easy," said Jasper, a Tampa resident. At 5-feet-5, Jasper is an inch shorter than Houston Astros second baseman Jose Altuve and an inch taller than Hall of Famer Wee Willie Keeler.

But Jasper stands tall in the Roy Hobbs World Series as likely the only former figure skater.

# **NOTEBOOK**

#### Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they check-in after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters).

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

#### Score Reporting

There is a QR code posted in every dugout that we will be using. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form, which includes places for your Player of the Game and your umpire evaluations.

#### **Results corrections**

Please check the posted results and standings each day. Managers should contact Rob at the Tournament Headquarters (234.200.8449) with corrections to scores.

That's the best way to make sure that playoff seedings and pairings are as accurate as we can make them.

#### Run-rule games

Run rule is 10 runs at 7 complete innings or if home team is ahead in a scheduled 9-inning game. Scheduled 7-inning games are 15 at 5 innings.

Now, in a 9-inning game, if the score difference is 15 at 5 innings, umpires have been instructed to call both managers together and to offer the team on the short end of the score if they want 6 outs to bat.

As far as RH is concerned the team ahead has won, but any runs scored will count in RA, so that is an incentive to not just put anyone out there to pitch.

Both teams must agree.

If you believe a game has been ended prematurely, don't leave and ask for a field manager; he will get in touch with headquarters for adjudication.

# No roof issues for these RHWS Rays

The Clearwater Rays, unlike the Tampa Bay Rays, did not lose the roof off their home field.

Of course, as an amateur team, the Clearwater Rays do not play in Tropicana Field, the St. Petersburg home of the big-league Rays.

The Clearwater Rays play their home games at recreational facilities about 20 miles north of Tropicana Field, which was decimated by Hurricane Milton. The stadium's roof was torn off and the Tampa Bay Rays don't know where they will play home games in 2025.

The Clearwater Rays don't have that worry. "No, we didn't have to worry about losing a roof," Clearwater co-manager Sean Newborn said.

While their big-league counterparts worry about where to play next year, the Clearwater Rays know where they are playing this week. They have access to big-league quality fields in Fort Myers.

Although the Clearwater Rays sport the name of an MLB team, Newborn said not every member of the team is fan of the big-league Rays.

"A lot of transplants," Newborn said of his roster. "A lot of Yankee fans. Chicago. Boston."

Newborn is a Nationals' fan. But the players on his team who have moved to Florida from north of the Mason-Dixon Line have sort of adopted the Rays.

"It's like the Rays are their second-best team," said Newborn, a high school English teacher and golf coach in Tampa.

It's the first choice, though, of the team's Damian Kondrotas, a Tampa Bay Rays season-ticket holder since 2005. He made sure back then that the seats were located behind a particularly loud heckler.

"I didn't want to be in front of him with him yelling in my ear," Kondrotas said.

Although the Tampa Bay Rays lost their roof, Kondrotas did not lose the roof off his home in Oldsmar, which is basically next to Clearwater.

And the team did not have to worry about losing a roof off their home fields.
