Somebody must don what used to be called the tools of ignorance. Even in the Roy Hobbs World Series with men

playing not only in their 40s and 50s but in their 60s, 70s and even 80s.

Who can do this?

Who wants to do this?

There are such hardy men out there. If not, the Roy Hobbs World Series could not exist.

Glen Goldberg, 75, of the New Jersey Wonderboys is one of those wonders. How long has he been catching?

"My whole life," Goldberg said Sunday morning sitting at a

picnic table at Hammond Stadium.

He played other positions as a young boy but as a teenager became a full-time catcher.

"Largely because it was a way to make the team because nobody wanted to catch," Goldberg said. "And I just sort of liked it."

He still likes it.

"You're in the middle of everything," Goldberg said, "You're in on every pitch. You're kind of a field captain. You get nice interaction with the umpire and the batter."

Mental adjustments have to be made in one's 70s.

"The biggest frustration is having a 15-year-old brain in a 75-year-old body," Goldberg said.

Steve Emerson of the Toledo Tigers did not start catching in his teens. Or 20s. Or 30s. Or 40s. Or 50s. Or 60s. He recently picked it up in his 70s.

"Sometimes I feel like an imposter," Emerson, 73, said.

He started catching in his Tampa league because more experienced catchers kept, as he put it, "breaking down."

As of the start of this week his catching resume included six games.

What was his first game like?

"It was a strange feeling being back there," Emerson said. He found himself flinching and blinking when batters swing at pitches.

Catching pop-ups is also a challenge.

"Haven't caught one yet," Emerson said.

But one did hit him on the head. Fortunately, he was wearing a helmet at the time.

Pat Venditte, 79, of the Toledo Tigers, is a life-long catcher who started at the age of 7 when he was a kid in Omaha. That's 72 years ago.

"When I started catching, I wanted to be like Chris Cannizaro," Venditte said,


Cannizzaro was a catcher for the minor-league Omaha Cardinals in 1958 and 1959 before going on to play 13 years in the majors.

Venditte is still catching and has yet to have a knee or hip replaced.

"All the parts are original," Venditte said.

Catching is not for everybody but it is for some.

"I wouldn't have it any other way," Goldberg said. "I absolutely love the position."

Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they check-in after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters).

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.



There is a QR code posted in every dugout that we will be using. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form, which includes places for your Player of the Game and your umpire evaluations.

Results corrections

Please check the posted results and standings each day. Managers should contact Rob at the Tournament Headquarters (234.200.8449) with corrections to scores.

That's the best way to make sure that playoff seedings and pairings are as accurate as we can make them.

Run-rule games

Run rule is 10 runs at 7 complete innings or if home team is ahead in a scheduled 9-inning game. Scheduled 7-inning games are 15 at 5 innings.

Now, in a 9-inning game, if the score difference is 15 at 5 innings, umpires have been instructed to call both managers together and to offer the team on the short end of the score if they want 6 outs to bat.

As far as RH is concerned the team ahead has won, but any runs scored will count in RA, so that is an incentive to not just put anyone out there to pitch.

Both teams must agree.


If you believe a game has been ended prematurely, don't leave and ask for a field manager; he will get in touch with headquarters for adjudication.


