HOF honors 3 players, 'ambassador'



Roy Hobbs Baseball

The Roy Hobbs Hall of Fame inducted 3 new members Saturday night at Sidelines Sports Bar & Grill in Fort Myers. Joe Williams, Rick Miller and Bill Russo were inducted.

Photographer Greg Wagner, the 2024 Brian Mullen Ambassador of Baseball honoree, was also recognized at the event, which was MC'd by Roy Hobbs president Tom Giffen.

Rick Miller has been described as "country strong." What does that mean?

Part of it is never quitting, according to Miller. But there is more.

"If you get knocked down, get right back up," said Miller, whose dad, Thomas, 80, and mom, Janet, 79, attended the ceremony. "Keep getting up."

It's also been said of Miller, founder and manager of the Murfreesboro Mudcats and Tennessee Dirtbags, that he lives the rest of the baseball year for the Roy Hobbs World Series.

"It seems like everything else is practice for this," Miller said. Russo is not only an excellent player and organizer, back home in Ohio he has served as a member of the Solon City Council. He is an organizational wizard who helped build the Greater Cleveland Adult Baseball league from eight teams and one division to 25 teams and 4 age divisions since 2010.

How does he manage to do so much?

"If you want to get something done give it to a busy man," Giffen said.

That's Russo.

"It wasn't going anywhere," Russo said of the Cleveland league. "Guys asked me to take it over."

Joe Williams was respectfully dubbed "El Asesino" by Dominican Republic rivals. That translates to The Assassin.

"Probably the biggest compliment I ever got," Williams said. It's a sign of respect for his ability as one of the best AAAA players in Roy Hobbs history.

Like all Roy Hobbs Hall of Famers, Williams has a profound love and respect for the game. As he walked through Sidelines he had a very slight limp.

"I just played all week," Williams said.

He played 8 games last week and will play this week. The Hoover, Alabama resident typically bats in the heart of the lineup for AAAA teams.

Somebody at the event addressed Wagner as "Mr. Ambassador."

"I am the ambassador to Fiji," Wagner jokingly said.

Alas, for Wagner, being the Roy Hobbs Ambassador does not include paid trips to South Pacific islands.

Although Wagner joked about being ambassador to Fiji the honor means a great deal to him. He's been a part of the Roy Hobbs World Series since the inaugural event in 1989. His late father, Bob, helped bring the World Series to Fort Myers in 1993. Bob Wagner was inducted into the Hall of Fame in its inaugural class.

Bob Wagner died in 2001. Greg had 12 family members and friends on hand to see him honored.

Greg and his cameras have been World Series fixtures for more than a third of a century, creating vivid action and feature photos. His photos are featured in the Inside Pitch.





Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they check-in after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters).

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these *non-qualified* pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

Score Reporting

There is a QR code posted in every dugout that we will be using. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form, which includes places for your Player of the Game and your umpire evaluations.

Results corrections

Please check the posted results and standings each day. Managers should contact Rob at the Tournament Headquarters (234.200.8449) with corrections to scores.

That's the best way to make sure that playoff seedings and pairings are as accurate as we can make them.

Run-rule games

Run rule is 10 runs at 7 complete innings or if home team is ahead in a scheduled 9-inning game. Scheduled 7-inning games are 15 at 5 innings.

Now, in a 9-inning game, if the score difference is 15 at 5 innings, umpires have been instructed to call both managers together and to offer the team on the short end of the score if they want 6 outs to bat.

As far as RH is concerned the team ahead has won, but any runs scored will count in RA, so that is an incentive to not just put anyone out there to pitch.


Both teams must agree.

If you believe a game has been ended prematurely, don't leave and ask for a field manager; he will get in touch with headquarters for adjudication.

Please help with dugouts

Roy Hobbs Baseball and the grounds crews need your help in the dugouts.

When your games are over and you are leaving the dugout, please police it for trash and cups, etc. Your assistance in cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated.

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Admission, \$2 a game

Admission continues at the Roy Hobbs World Series.

Admission is \$2 per game or \$8 for a tournament pass. The player ID card grants players access to all games in which they are not playing. Spectators will pay \$2 for entrance into each complex and are good for one day at all complexes.

The \$8 tournament pass is available at RH Headquarters or from the Site Concierges at each security table; there is no family pass. The tournament pass is a plastic card that guarantees admission for that person for the duration of the RHWS. A loop comes with the tournament pass card for easy attachment to purses, beltloops, etc.
