Thunder embraces baseball brotherhood

The Baltimore Thunder has been making noise at the Roy Hobbs World Series for more than 20 years.

Thunder manager Scott Smith said the team's first year here was 2002. They were then known as the Baltimore Angels.

"We had no clue what we were doing and got to the championship," Smith, 56, said Sunday morning at the PDC. "We had a great time."

And they were hooked.

By whatever name, the men on the team love the World Series and baseball.

Smith said when he was young, he worked at a company that had a softball team. So, like many Roy Hobbs players he played softball for a while.

Then. ...

"I found out there was a 30 and older league and we just started playing ball," Smith said.

He meant real ball. Baseball. The real game.

Smith is a retired Frito-Lay supervisor who ran a warehouse for the company in Aberdeen, Maryland.

His duties included telling drivers where to make deliveries. Now he runs the Thunder and helps instill a sense of camaraderie on the team. It must be working. The team roster is stable.

"We all get along and yet we haven't seen each other in a year," the Thunder's Adrian Harris said. "It's like playing with your brothers."

That's a theme echoed by teammate Les Edwards.

"It's like we don't miss a beat," Edwards said.

Then there's the competition.

"You're playing against the best of the best," Harris said.

It's not just teams from Maryland.

"You meet people from all over the world," Edwards said, "And they're here to do the same thing."

The Thunder were at the PDC Sunday playing at the old Boston Red Sox spring training complex. It's a facility where Hall of Famers such as Pedro Martinez and David Ortiz prepared for seasons. Harris knows the history of all the Roy Hobbs World Series venues, places where other Hall of Famers have played over a century.

"These are spring training facilities and it's just an honor," Harris said.

Most Thunder players are from the Baltimore area but there are also six from Miami such as Pete Rivero, who signed on with the Thunder as a free agent in 2018.

He enjoys playing with the Thunder. Why else would he remain with the team?

"We're just blessed to be out here," Rivero, 56, said.

A part of the team is Smith's wife, Melanie. She is a scorekeeper, statistician and scout all rolled into one. Well, she has another job.

Her husband has dubbed her the Thunder's Vice President of Baseball Operations

The team's bats must have thundered Sunday morning. The Thunder beat Bellacino's Red Sox, 18-6.



Parking

Please abide by parking guidelines, avoid no parking signs, fire lanes and curbs, and handicap spaces without a permit. Lee County Rangers are patrolling sites and will issue tickets to violators. They are not cheap.

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Admission, \$2 a game

player ID card grants players access to all games in which they are not playing. Spectators will pay \$2 for entrance into each complex and are good for one day at all complexes.

The \$8 tournament pass is available at RH Headquarters or from the Site Concierges at each security table; there is no family pass. The tournament pass is a plastic card that guarantees admission for that person for the duration of the RHWS. A loop comes with the tournament pass card for easy attachment to purses, beltloops, etc.

Please help with dugouts

Roy Hobbs Baseball and the grounds crews need your help in the dugouts.

When your games are over and you are leaving the dugout, please police it for trash and cups, etc. Your assistance in cleaning up the dugouts each day will be greatly appreciated.

Playing site security

The active steps taken several years ago to deal with parking lot security will continue as parking lot theft issues have – knock on wood – not been an issue the last 7 years.

Are we out of the woods? No, it is a daily procedure and effort to make sure parking lots are safe.

Once again, Roy Hobbs will have personnel posted at the player/spectators' entrances to Terry Park, PDC, JetBlue Complex and at the entrance to the Quad fields at Lee County.

These individuals will have a view of the parking lot, and they will be available in emergencies, be enforcing cooler guidelines and handling admissions.
