The Minnesota Catfish arrived at that distinctive name through an exercise in democracy.

Manager Dan Hennen said the team conducted a survey of members about 3 years ago.

Other names were bandied about such as Camels, Snappers and Liger, which is a mix of Lion and Tiger.

Catfish won out every time through 3 rounds of on-line voting.

"Everybody just seemed to like it,"

Hennen said Tuesday morning at the Lee Health Sports Complex before a game against the Virginia Vikings at Field 3. "I didn't want to pick arbitrarily. I wanted input from the players."

The vote apparently wasn't unanimous.

As Hennen explained all this in the bleachers by the third base dugout, a player playfully shouted, "We should have been the Snappers! Just saying."

Shortstop Zach Wells likes the name but when he posted on Facebook that he was on the Catfish team a friend jokingly suggested something else.

"Are you sure you're not being catfished?"

Catfishing is a way to deceive people on-line with a false identity to lure them into something inappropriate.

The Minnesota Catfish are what they claim to be - a Roy Hobbs World Series baseball team.

Wells certainly knows that for certain. This is the third year on the team for the Canadian poet, essayist and published author as well as labor repre-

sentative at Saint Mary's University in Halifax.

But he was a big-league Catfish.

"I don't even know him," Hennen said. "Oh, really." Really.

"That's news to me," said Wells. "I'm a pretty big history nut. When I was a kid, I had this big statistical Bible going back to the Dead Ball era."

Maybe it took a trip from Nova Scotia to Fort Myers to play with the Minnesota Catfish to learn about Catfish Metkovich.

The Catfish name is noticed by other teams, according to Hennen.

"People get a chuckle out of it," Hennen said.

Hopefully, nobody points out the catfish is a bottom feeder.



No alcohol at sites

Roy Hobbs Baseball prohibits alcohol at all playing sites ... dugouts, inside fences and in the parking lots. Violators are subject to dismissal from the World Series, period.

Parkina

Please abide by parking guidelines, avoid no parking signs, fire lanes and curbs, and handicap spaces without a permit. Lee County Rangers are patrolling sites and will issue tickets to violators. They are not cheap.

First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Admission, \$2 a game

Admission continues at the Roy Hobbs World Series.

Admission is \$2 per game or \$8 for a tournament pass. The player ID card grants players access to all games in which they are not playing. Spectators will pay \$2 for entrance into each complex and are good for one day at all complexes.

The \$8 tournament pass is available at RH Headquarters or from the Site Concierges at each security table; there is no family pass. The tournament pass is a plastic card that guarantees admission for that person for the duration of the RHWS. A loop comes with the tournament pass card for easy attachment to purses, beltloops, etc.
