Montella's 9/II guilt: 'A huge hole in me'

Anthony Montella couldn't publicly talk about 9/11 for nearly a quarter of a century.

Now, the 60-year-old member of the Twin Peaks Lumberjacks is ready.

He carries memories, scars and loss on a scale not many know. On 9/11 he was a New York City firefighter. He was starting vacation that morning and was out on Long Island preparing to go fishing, roughly 100 miles from the Twin Towers.

Then the call came. Turn on the TV. What channel? Any channel.

Montella did not go fishing. He turned around and raced to the city to help. That's what firefighters do.

By time he got there the Twin Towers were down. Many of his friends and colleagues were dead. He's worn that grief and survivor's guilt ever since.

That's until Sept. 11, 2025. The Vero Beach resident spoke about 9/11 at a Patriots Day event at the Indian River County Fairgrounds Expo Center on Florida's east coast.

His wife, Erin, was in the front row. Hundreds of strangers filled the venue. It was time. He was welcomed by the audience.

"I felt complete love from strangers," Montella said.

He also spoke beneath the Hammond Stadium stands on Monday.

The survivor's guilt and the friends lost remain immense burdens. He needed something. He drank. He drank before games. He even drank during games.

Before his speech he had a dream. He felt his departed firefighters during the speech. He could feel the presence of angels telling him to "to let the guilt go."

Montella is a spiritual man who

wears a gold cross around his neck. The cross was fashioned from his father's wedding band.

Something happened that day in Indian River County.

"I saw two rainbows in the direction I was heading," Montella said.

The rainbows remained for about 20 minutes.

"I walked in there confident that I wasn't alone." Montella said.

Erin was there for him as he worked through 50 drafts of the speech. She said the speech was a "game-changer" for

"He was having trouble sleeping at night and tying to think about all the elements of the story," Erin said.

She was concerned if he could get through the speech without breaking down.

"He was incredibly strong," Erin said.

For 24 years he's employed another coping mechanism.

"I've coped with it by being a good man," Montella said.

On that day, 343 New York City firefighters died. Many were his friends. Many others were colleagues.

"I feel like I have a hole, a huge hole in me," Montella said Monday.

He helped fill that hole with drinking. Montella is a bourbon connoisseur who often had double bourbons, sometimes three or four a night.

"Yesterday was the first time, I think, I played baseball in years where I didn't have a drink before," Montella said. "Or two drinks. Or three drinks."

He's moving past survivor's guilt.


"I don't have that guilt washing over me anymore," Montella said. "It's not going away over night, but it is. I'm healing. ... I'm having a blast. ... I didn't give up drinking. I gave up using it as a crutch to get through emotional moments."

There have been countless emotional moments for Anthony Montella since 9/11.











First Aid

Two key First Aid items: Drink plenty of fluids while playing; don't just wait until the game is over. Water will be available at the fields.

Second, be sure to stretch and loosen up before playing, or even re-entering a game.

In case of an emergency, contact the field manager at your site. He has the

First Aid supplies and will contact 911 services as needed.

Ice is available for injuries ... check with the field manager on duty or go to the nearest concession stand to have the appropriate personnel paged. Roy Hobbs requests that managers plan for pitchers needing ice for their arms and to supply it.

Playing site security

The active steps taken several years ago to deal with parking lot security will continue as parking lot theft issues have – knock on wood – not been an issue the last 7 years.

Are we out of the woods? No, it is a daily procedure and effort to make sure parking lots are safe.

Once again, Roy Hobbs will have personnel posted at the player/spectators' entrances to Terry Park, PDC, JetBlue Complex and at the entrance to the Quad fields at Lee County.

These individuals will have a view of the parking lot, and they will be available in emergencies, be enforcing cooler guidelines and handling admissions.

Customer Service

Roy Hobbs Baseball is proud of its record on customer service.

Staff members are required to wear identifying staff shirts during the working hours of the tournament and should be easily identifiable. At least two are assigned to each of the satellite complexes daily.

In the case of **emergency**, please go to the nearest concession stand at the satellite complexes, where someone will be available to summon help.

Roy Hobbs field managers and key personnel are Red Cross First Aid **certified**, and Roy Hobbs Baseball has guidelines in place on the handling of injuries. Additionally, **AED devices** are available at each of the facilities, and Roy Hobbs personnel have been trained on those devices.

Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings – 6 outs or 10 hitters – during pool play, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they check-in after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters).

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these non-qualified pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must



return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

Run-rule games

Run rule is 10 runs at 7 complete innings or if home team is ahead in a scheduled 9-inning game. Scheduled 7-inning games are 15 at 5 innings.

Now, in a 9-inning game, if the score difference is 15 at 5 innings, umpires have been instructed to call both managers together and to offer the team on the short end of the score if they want 6 outs to bat.

As far as RH is concerned the team ahead has won, but any runs scored will count in RA, so that is an incentive to not just put anyone out there to pitch.

Both teams must agree.

If you believe a game has been ended prematurely, don't leave and ask for a field manager; he will get in touch with headquarters for adjudication.
