# Two heart victims are back in the dugout

Roger Laurella and Paul Williams don't know each other but they have something in common.

Both are heart attack survivors. Laurella of the Chicago Blues had his heart attack in his kitchen in Evergreen Park, Ill. Williams, of the Baltimore Baseball Club, had his in the Terry Park restroom during the 2024 Roy Hobbs World Series.

Both are in the 2025 Roy Hobbs World Series, Laurella, 67, collapsed on June 13. His wife, Cindy, found him.

He chatted earlier in the week during a game at the PDC.

"Here I am," said Laurella, a 2016 Roy Hobbs Hall of Fame inductee. "That's what's amazing."

Neither man is playing this week. They are running their teams. That is the key word - teams.

"Just to be with the guys," Laurella said.

Laurella had bypass surgery on July 19. Now, four months later he is in his Blues uniform. He knows the heart attack he suffered was serious,

"It was the widow-maker," Laurella said.

While Laurella was stricken at home, Williams was far from his home in Raleigh, N.C. and his wife, Nina.

Roy Hobbs has provided Williams, an Army vet, with a second chance at baseball.

"I was drafted into the Army when my buddies were drafted into baseball," Williams, 77, said.


He was given a second chance at life during the 2024 RHWS. Before a Terry Park game he took seven or eight swings in the batting cage but didn't feel well.

He went into the restroom to splash water on his face, thinking maybe he was dehydrated. He started to walk out but then felt a "quick pain" in the middle of his back.

He reached back and sat down. A teammate walked in and thought initially Williams was doing a stretching exercise.

"He actually asked me what kind of exercise is that," Williams said.

Soon, everybody realized Williams was in distress. A doctor from another team raced to his aid. Terry Park field manager Charles Anderson helped with a defibrillator. Somebody called 911.

Paramedics arrived and Williams was transported to Lee Health. In the ambulance, an EMT said he was going to give Williams something to relax him.

"I woke up five days later," Williams said. When he woke up in his hospital room, he saw a blond woman dressed in white with a light behind her.

Williams asked, "Are you an angel?" Close. It was the hospital chaplain. Faith runs through both stories.

Laurella's best friend, Ray Trzeciak was there for the surgery.

"The doctor came out and said, 'I don't know what synagogue or church this guy goes to but he is the luckiest man," Trzciak said

The lucky man knows it.


"I've been given a second chance," Laurella said. "Happy as hell."

Roger Laurella of the Chicago Blues (left) and Paul Williams of the Baltimore Baseball Club (right)













#### Playoff pitching guidelines

Roy Hobbs requirement is that all pitchers who will be starters or closers in save situations (3-run or less difference in the 8th and 9th innings) qualify for the playoffs by pitching at least 2 innings - 6 outs or 10 hitters - during pool play, if they are in the dugout starting Sunday. If they check-in after Monday's games, they must pitch 5 innings (15 outs or 25 hitters).

AAAA qualifier teams may not add pitchers to their lineup after Pool Play concludes; however, AAAA teams may bring in 2 position players after Tuesday's games, but they must play the entire first game of the playoffs with no shared lineup options.

Finally, in the playoffs, those "non-qualified" middle-inning pitchers will come to the mound from their normal defensive positions where they started the game. That is as important as the "spirit of the rule" that these non-qualified pitchers who are used as "inning-eaters" are players who ordinarily are playing other positions.

And, please remember that any players leaving the RHWS today (Monday) to return on Thursday MUST turn in their player ID Card and re-register upon their return. They must return before the quarterfinals of the playoffs, regardless of division.

#### No alcohol at sites

Roy Hobbs Baseball prohibits alcohol at all playing sites ... dugouts, inside fences and in the parking lots. Violators are

#### **Parking**

Please abide by parking guidelines, avoid no parking signs, fire lanes and curbs, and handicap spaces without a permit. Lee County Rangers are patrolling sites and will issue tickets to violators. They are not cheap.

#### **Score Reporting System Primer**

The system – Mighty Forms – we were using in the past went belly up 10 days ago after a massive internet meltdown.

So here's how we are getting scores: There is a QR code posted in every dugout. Scan the code with your phone after every game and complete the score submission form, which includes places for your Player of the Game and your umpire evaluations.

- 1. Click on <u>royhobbs.com</u>. Some phones will show the royhobbs with a white outline. Then, you will see Game Schedule at the top of the page.
- 2. In the box that says search teams enter your team name.
- 3. Tournament is Roy Hobbs World Series beyond the 3 dots, it says 2025.
- 4. There is a Division dropdown. This week Legends 53+.
- 5. Then you see today's date.
- 6. Then your game(s) show up, and you click on Report Score.
- 7. You enter scores. When your opponent enters the score and they match then the score is confirmed.
- 8. Then, as an option, you can enter player of the game (first and last names) and, if you wish, rate umpires.
- 9. Submit, and thank you.
